From national captain Aminul Islam cracked an unbeaten half-century to lead Bangladesh A to a comprehensive seven-wicket win over BCB Development Squad in the inaugural Challenge Trophy match at the Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium yester-

Aminul was not out on 63 as the second string Bangladesh side. resuming the day on 60 for no loss and needing 146 more runs for a win. reached home during the post lunch session of the final day of the four-day

Coming in to bat at number four after his team lost the third wicket on 125, Aminul shared an unbeaten 83run stand for the fourth wicket with another former Bangladesh captain Akram Khan, who was three runs shy of half-century.

Aminul, who scored 145 in Bangladesh's inaugural Test against India in November 2000, faced 101 balls and hit seven boundaries in his 126-minute vigil at the crease.

On the other hand, Akram, recovering from a shaky start, took the young bowlers to the sword, smashing two sixes and half a dozen of fours off 79 Two other former national captains.

Minhazul Abedin and Naimur Rahman, in the Ateam were also there to impress the selectors for senior team. Naimur Rahman managed 21 and Minhazul did not get a chance to bat in the second innings.

## Australia close door on Mark

Veteran batsman Mark Waugh has been dumped from the Australian cricket team due to play England in the first Ashes Test in Brisbane on November 7, cricket officials announced Monday.

After a string of disappointing run-scorers, the 37-year-old vet-

Lehmann, who also plays for English country Yorkshire, was the most obvious candidate to replace Waugh after he was picked for Australia's last two Test tours, but failed to make the team for any matches.

The left-hander has played five Tests, the last against England in Sydney in 1998-99, but he has been a prolific scorer in first-class cricket.

Lehmann had waited years for the recall after cementing his place in the Australian one-day side following the axing of the Waugh twins earlier this year.

His limited Test appearances have yielded 228 runs at an average

Steve, who played 108 tests alongside him, said he would miss his brother's presence when he leads Australia on the field for next month's first Ashes test against England.

"Since his one-day international debut against Pakistan in 1988-89, Mark has been a near-permanent fixture in an Australian side that has enjoyed outstanding success."
