These essays show that contrary to the widespread belief, nationalism is not all about the celebration of territory as a marker of identity and power; it is also about time in a fundamental way. The anxiety over time is as fundamental as the one over space. Indeed space appears as one in the distribution of the elements than go into making the time of nationalism.

The author contends that, each time the nationalist destiny of Muslim Bengal took a clearly discernible turn, it seemed to the actors as final and irrevocable -- the actors of 1937, 1947, 1954, 1957, or 1971. 



Today's world is characterized by the fact that the economic wealth of the planet is the highest in human history. At the same time the number of people suffering from abject poverty has never been greater in human experience, nor has global environmental degradation, particularly caused by anthropogenic factors, ever been any worse. The concept of sustainable development has encapsulated the mechanisms for integrating environment and development at the Earth Summit, in 1992. Many of the key actors in the UNCED process highlighted that there could be no sustainable development without the elimination, or at least, the alleviation of poverty. Poverty-environment was identified as the missing link in UNCED and needed immediate attention.



Problems of Governance in South Asia
