In Moscow, Foreign Minister Igor Ivanov said "we have come close on a whole range of issues" but some "serious differences" over the proposed UN resolution remained.

The US secretary of state spoke with French Foreign Minister Dominique de Villepin, whose country also opposes the immediate threat of military force, and Foreign Secretary Jack Straw of Britain, which backs the US campaign for a hardline warning to Iraq.

Britain and France are among the ive permanent members of the Security Council, along with the United States, Russia and China.

Hans Blix, the chief UN weapons inspector, again met Security Council members on Friday and UN inspectors will go to Cyprus this weekend to start setting up a staging post for their operations in Iraq, a UN source said Friday.

UN identity cards before flying to Iraq, will be in the southern port of Larnaca.

Blix has said an advance party could arrive in Baghdad between seven and 10 days after a resolution

Hussein meanwhile said they would meet in Brussels from November 22 to November 25 in a bid to formulate a common vision of Iraq's future.

Representatives of the whole spectrum of the Iraqi opposition, academics, tribal figures and others have been invited to attend the gathering, totalling around 200, said Hamed al-Bayati, London representative of the Supreme Council for the Islamic Revolution in Iraq (SCIRI).

Invitations will also be sent to the five permanent members of the UN Security Council, a number of European countries and Iraq's neighbours -- Jordan, Syria, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Turkey and Iran -- in addition to Egypt.

He was widely criticised for corruption and non-performance of his administration and the implementation of India's recently promulgated anti-terrorism law, the Prevention of Terrorism Act (POTA) in Kashmir.

(GD) filed with the Cantonment Police Station identified him as an extortionist and alleged that he died while being transported to the army camp. Instead of handing over Jahangir's body to his family, the army turned it over to the Pallabi Police Station.

Sources said the autopsy report attributed injuries to the death. Jahangir's wife Rashida told the press that on his arrest Jahangir was

tied with a rope and beaten up right

before his family members. Jahangir was a fish merchant and had disputes with some people over fisheries. Someone might have victimised him in that connection, sources and family members

observed. In Gopalganj, former BNP leader and Kashiani thana Muktijoddha Sangsad Commander Abul Khayer Ratan Mollah, 54, died in army custody on October 19.

He was arrested early morning that day and admitted to the Gopalganj Sadar Hospital in the evening. His autopsy was conducted amid army presence and a UD case was filed.

Mollah's family alleged he was tortured to death.

Bhola district Sramik League General Secretary Amirul Islam Chowdhury Rocket was arrested at noon on October 21. He was admitted to the Bhola Sadar Hospital in the evening next day where he died. His body was handed over to his family on October 23.

Ratna Chowdhury, his wife, told Iraqi opponents of Saddam | journalists that army men had beaten him with the rifle butt before

The army allegedly recovered 29 rounds of bullets from Rocket's residence. He was tortured in army custody and then brought back to his residence asking him to hand over more arms, alleged Ratna. When he came back, he could not stand on his feet as his legs appeared to be broken. In such a condition, the army took him to the hospital.

Twenty-eight-year old Afzal Hossain of Savar died at 10:00pm in army custody on October 21. The autopsy was conducted the next day after which policemen escorted his body to his village home. The body was buried in police presence and a UD case stating that he died of heart attack was filed with the Savar Police Station. His body had injury marks. A court had set Afzal free on bail in a murder case.

Saifuzzaman, 35 of Gaibandha's Sadallapur Upazila was arrested at the night of October 21. He died the following night in army custody. His autopsy was held in Gaibandha Adhunik Hospital on October 23. Civil Surgeon Abdul Kuddus said he died of heart attack. His body was buried amid army and police secu-

The police alleged that Saifuzzaman was involved in currency counterfeit. But there was no

case against him. Nazmul Haq Milon, 40 of Ambagan, Rajshahi was arrested on October 23 from local Barnali Cinema Hall premises where he used to work. He died in army cus-

tody the same day. An army personnel named Jahangir of Bogra Cantonment admitted Milon to the Rajshahi Medical College Hospital. A doctor at the RMCH, Gopendranath Achariya, said after Jahangir was brought to the hospital, "he did not

need any treatment". Rajshahi army task force Commander Brigadier General Aminul Hasan at a press conference claimed that Milon died of heart attack.

Magistrate Abdul Bari who gave the inquest report on Milon's death said there was no scope for any comment regarding the death. The RMCH Forensic Medicine Department chief Dr Ashraful Alam made similar comment.

However, Milon's wife Firoza Begum alleged her husband's body had multiple injury marks, Sources said the autopsy report corroborated her claim.

Milon's father Abdur Rahman Pachu told The Daily Star that his son did not have any disease. He said he would sue the government for his son's death. Milon, a BNP activist, was previously accused in two cases related to capturing tender. However, the cases were disposed

of. Sources said in the past he worked for a notorious criminal named Gamma.

His body was handed over to his family in army presence while he was buried amid police guard. Former Pangsha Upazila BNP

General Secretary and Pourashabha Chairman Abdul Aziz Sardar, 47, was picked up by army from his home on October 24. At 11:00pm next day, he was taken to the Rajbari Sadar Hospital in a critical condition. There the doctor declared him dead on arrival.

An UD case filed in this connection states that he died of heart attack. It is said that Sardar used to give shelter to some criminals.

On October 26, army personnel picked up four labourers from their sleep from the Chowmuhani Rail Station. According to local journalists and police, the army woke the sleeping labourers up by charging batons. Later, they were handed over to the Begumganj Police Station and later sent to the local hospital. The condition of one of the labourers, Khurshid, 35, worsened there and he was sent to the Noakhali Sadar

Hospital where he died. Feni Brigade Major Tofael told journalists the four labourers were handed over to the police at 6:30am that day. They were all in normal health and they boarded the police on their own. Khurshid died at 9:00 am in police custody. He added that these four persons were taken for interrogation as per information given by members of a band of

But police said the labourers were injured when they received them and that the army personnel had given a written note during the hand-over.

Khorshed is the son of a Monu Mia and a homeless labourer. The Begumganj Police Station had no complaint against him. Cousin of opposition Awami League lawmaker Sheikh Helal

Uddin, Masum Biswas, 35, was arrested from his Khulna residence at 2:00am on October 22. He was blindfolded and beaten up before his family members. A licensed gun was seized from his brother's house during the incident. As his condition deteriorated due to the torture, he was sent to the

Khulna Medical College Hospital and later to the DMCH on October 23 unconscious.

Masum's sister Lucky and sisterin-law Anjumanara alleged the army men kept beating him up as they took him away. When they brought him back later on, he could not stand up as his leg seemed broken.

Abul Hossain Litu, 32, son of one Wahed Ali, died in Savar jail custody on October 28. Earlier, three persons including Litu were picked up from the Poultry Farm area in Savar around noon the same day. No arms were found in their possessions. Later at 3:30pm, Litu was admitted to the Combined Military Hospital

where he died in the evening. Army sources claimed that Litu died after falling from a two-storied building during his failed bid to

Mehnaj Hossain Anjana, wife of the victim, alleged that there were no two-storied building at the place from where army nabbed Litu. So, Anjana said, there was no question building.

up from a tin-shed house and tied him with a tree and beat him to death. She said those who saw the body could easily guess that Litu was brutally tortured.

Accused criminal Jamiruddin, 32, of Golapganj Upazila in Sylhet died in army custody on October 29. After picking him up from Raigarh village, army took him to an army camp and beat him up. Being informed by Jamiruddin, army seized lethal weapons like ramdah, chapati and some spent bullets from

a nearby hill. As he was rushed to the Golapganj Upazila Health Complex at 5:00 in the afternoon doctors declared him dead. Eyewitnesses said army beat up Jamiruddin at the playground of local Dhaka Dakhsmin School.

On the contrary, army sources claimed that Jamiruddin died after falling from the hill as he tried to escape while accompanying the army men during the arms seizure.

Beaten up during an army drive, constable Kalachand Tripura of the Rajakhali Police Outpost under Pekua Upazila died at the Combined Military Hospital (CMH), Chittagong on October 28.

Police alleged that army beat up Tripura on suspicion that he had leaked in advance the news of an army drive at Rajakhali area on October 24.

In a report sent to the Police Headquarters, the Cox's Bazar district police stated that army held Syed Hossain, an assistant subinspector (ASI) of the outpost, responsible for not being able to nab the criminals. Failing to locate the ASI, army took constable Tripura

In another report sent to the police superintendent of Cox's Bazar, the assistant superintendent of police of the circle concerned also noted that Tripura lost conscious ness when he was hit by baton Injured Tripura later died at the hospital. Doctors at the CMH declined to

comment on the cause of Tripura's death. Dr Zillur Rahman operated upon Tripura's head on October 26. When contacted, Dr Rahman declined to comment on the matter; instead he suggested that the director of the hospital be contacted.

Deputy director of the hospital Purabi Ghosh told journalists that no cause of brain haemorrhage could be ascertained. Tripura's wife said her husband was in good

The Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal leader in Panchagarh, Jennifer Said King, 25, died on October 30 in arm custody. Army picked 'King on allegation of extortion. His family members alleged that army tortured King to death. The army camp concerned brushed aside this allegation.

King's mother Amena Khatun and elder brother Abdus Sattar told newsmen that while King was asking for dues of the tree he had sold to a saw mill owner army nabbed him. He was beaten up and handed over to police at 10:00 that night. He was admitted to the Sadar Hospital and later sent to jail after being produced before court. But as his condition deteriorated, the following day King was re-admitted to the hospital where he died the next morning.

Officer in charge of the Panchagarh Police Station Taherul Islam said police received King from army in a critical condition. Acting Jail Superintendent of Panchagarh Md Sajedul Islam corroborated the statement.

Tota Miah, 37, died within five hours of his arrest by army in Madaripur on October 29. Army sources said upon tips from Tota they searched a house for arms but did not find any. As they were returning from that house Tota suffered heart attack.

The following morning he died after half an hour of being admitted to the Madaripur Sadar Hospital. During the entire period, army personnel kept the hospital under

Twenty-four-year old Abu Sayed Delu died at the Chest Diseases Hospital in the capital on October 29, six days after his arrest in

Army picked up Delu on October of her husband jumping from a 22 and turned him over to the Begumganj Police Station the fol-She alleged that army picked Litu lowing day. Environment group Friends of the Earth said little progress had been made here.

"The negotiations around the Kyoto process made little progress with the US and Saudi Arabia manipulating every disagreement to drive a wedge between industrialised and developing countries," a

statement said. It said many of the provisions of the Delhi Declaration had been

lifted out of old conventions. However TR Baalu, president of the UN's eighth climate-change conference, dismissed the criticism.

"Negotiating a consensus declaration with 170 countries and 10 regional groups is not an ordinary issue. At times it gets difficult," he said, adding he was happy a consensus had been reached. Indian officials earlier said in allnight discussions Thursday, devel-
