Liverpool coach Gerard Houllier described himself as in awe of his side's resilience after a Michael Owen double sent them seven points clear at the top of the English Premiership.

With second-placed Arsenal not playing until Sunday, Houllier's men bounced back from their midweek Champions League defeat by Valencia with a 2-0 win over struggling West Ham at Anfield.

Manchester United moved up to third, eight points behind Liverpool, with a 2-1 win over Southampton that was secured by a late strike from Diego Forlan.

"The passing, running and the level of energy they put after the Valencia loss stunned me," Houllier said after watching his side make it nine wins out of 12 in the Premiership.

"It exceeded my expectations. But this is a squad that knows what they have and what they can do and when they desire something together they can be awesome.

'We will not get carried away by anything but we will enjoy our position. The players always keep their feet on the ground but they know what their purpose is and we will just carry on.

Owen could have had a hat-trick before he finally put Liverpool ahead in the 27th minute with a marvellous solo effort, eliminating three West Ham defenders before firing home

His second, ten minutes after the break, was a scrappier affair with the England striker slipping as he prepared to shoot.

But the ball still made it over the line with the help of a touch by West Ham defender Christian Dailly and Owen will certainly be claiming it as his 11th goal this season.


