As the house owner opened the gate, they entered the house, tied up all the inmates at gunpoint and looted Tk five lakh, 400 gms of gold ornament and other valuables. The robbers decamped in a trawler.

9 get life term for killing three in Netrakona

The Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court, Netrakona, yesterday sentenced nine people to life term imprisonment for killing three persons.

The convicts are Abul Mia. Ali Hadis Mollick, Nurul Islam, Kalam, Nazu, Khalegue and Momin, All the nine hail from village Mozaffarpur under Kendua upazila of the district.

The court also fined the convicts Tk 5000 each, in default, they will have to suffer five more months in the jail.

According to the prosecution the accused killed Ataul. Mokshud Ali and Shahid of the same village on December 5, 1996 as a sequel to previous enmity.

Judge Mohammad Aminul Islam, after examining the records and witnesses, pronounced the verdict.

The statement also said that the earlier order to cancel licenses of the arms that were not deposited in time and were also seized would remain effective.

Legal measures will be taken against violators of the order under the Arms Act of 1978.


