Brazilian striker Ronaldo succeeded his Real Madrid teammate Zinedine Zidane as French magazine Onze Mondial's player-of-theyear on Friday.

Ronaldo, who joined Real from Inter Milan in a controversial transfer worth 45 million euros (45.10 million dollars) at the start of the season, said the award was recognition for his performances at this year's World Cup.

"Winning the World Cup and being top scorer have made this prize possible and I am obviously very pleased with it," he told reporters after receiving the award at Real's training ground on Friday.

"It is an important prize and after overcoming two years of problems, winning it has made me very happy and I hope that others will follow."

Ronaldo, who also won the award in 1997, is one of the favourites to win Europe's Balon D'Or and the FIFA world-player- of-the-year, which are awarded next month.
