Deportivo Coruna midfielder Aldo Duscher, whose reckless challenge on David Beckham threatened the Manchester United player's participation in this year's World Cup, is hoping to swap shirts with him.

Duscher will get his chance when he comes face to face with Beckham again in the second stage of the Champions League.

The Argentine's wild tackle during his side's Champions League quarterfinal defeat at Old Trafford last April broke a bone in Beckham's foot, leaving the England captain's World Cup hopes in the balance.

Beckham, however, made a speedy recovery from the injury and was able to lead England in their campaign in South Korea and

"It was an unlucky tackle and I never wanted to injure him," said

Duscher. "When I saw him play in the World Cup after all that had happened I was really pleased.

Duscher was vilified in the British press in an incident that was portraved by tabloids in both countries as the latest episode in the longstanding rivalry between Argentina and England.

Duscher had to go into hiding after the incident which threatened to stop Beckham from appearing in the World Cup

But, after learning he would face Beckham again. Duscher revealed how the United ace forgave him and rejected calls he had deliberately been fouled.

Duscher said: "David proved to be as remarkable a person as he is talented as a footballer after that wretched match when I injured him last season.

"I'm delighted to be playing against him again because it should give me the chance to thank him personally for all he did for me after our Champions League

"Everything was blown out of all proportion because it was an England player before the World Cup, but my telephone conversation with David put my mind at rest.

"He told me he knew I had no intention of 'doing him' and the injury was a fluke rather than deliberate.


