Diarrhoea kills 6 in Mymensingh

Diarrhoea claimed at least six lives at village Dhakir Kanda in Phulpur

upazila within 24 days. Five members of two families including a mother and her minor daughter included in the death toll from October 10 to November 3, according to the Civil Surgeon

Hazera, 5, Rashedul, 2, and Shamsuddin, 9, daughter and sons of Abu Taher Munshi died of diarrhoea on October 13 and October 14 respectively Farzana, 5, daugher of Abu Taher also died of diarrhoea

in the second week of October. Aklima Khatun, 5, daughter of Md Mostafa and Achhia Khatun, 30, mother of Aklima Khatun and wife of Md Mostafa died of diarrhoea on November 1 and November 3 respectively at village Dhakir Kanda in Phulpur upazila.

However, according to official record of the civil surgeon office from October 1 to October 22, some 1653 persons were affected with diarrhoea at nine upazilas here.

One hundred twenty eight persons were affected in Iswargani upazila, 577 persons in Phulpur, 282 in Haluaghat, 220 in Trishal, 198 in Phulbaria, 113 in Muktagacha, 72 in Bhaluka, 54 in Dhubaura while nine persons were affected in Gouripur

But another sources said the number of death and affected people would be more than the official

When contacted, Dr Nasir Uddin Mahmud, Medical Officer for Disease Control and Surveillance told The Daily Star that 12 control rooms, were opened at 12 upazila health complexes and 158 medical teams were formed to contain the

He also informed that there are cases of diarrhoea in Sadar, Phulpur and Iswarganj upazilas claiming that the situation improved further than that of the previous month as there is no report of death after November 3. He also added that the number of affected people is more this year than the previous year, but the death toll is still less than that of the last

year. Diarrhoea claimed 16 lives last year. Due to lack of pure drinking and faulty treatment of village doctors, the diarrhoea affected people die, said another sources.

Meanwhile, a total of 163 diarrhoea patients were admitted at Surjo Kanta (SK) Hospital, an infectious ward of Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) from November 1 to November 10 (3 pm). On average of 16 people were

On November 9, 22 patients were admitted at SK Hospital. They are Moni, 19, Kamal, 60, Rajib, 3 Zubeda Khatu, 55, Tainy, 2 Mustafa, 30, Reza, 30, Zubeda, 35, Phuljan, 45, Shakil, 4, Nurul Hoq, 45, Doly, 25, Sathi, 2, Roshni, 4 Sufia, 28, Khadiza, 40, Aysha, 15 Sabbir, 7, Atikur Rahman, 28, Tultul, 12 Tofazzol Hossain 20, and Zubeda, 60.

20 Sylhet polytechnic instt students hurt in clash with cops, construction workers

Twenty students of Sylhet Polytechnic Institute were injured in a series of clashes with construction workers and police Sunday.

Witnesses said the trouble ensued when a guard of an underconstruction railway station near the institute dragged a student into the construction site and beat him up following an altercation with him.

Later, a group of 25 students came to the construction site and locked in a clash with the workers, leaving 11 students injured.

Angered by the attacks, over 100 students later rushed to the spot in a

procession and clashed with police as they did not allow them to enter the construction site.

Nine students were injured as police charged baton and lobbed teargas shells to disperse them.

Police arrested three students and two construction workers from

Three of the injured were admitted to Sylhet Osmani Medical Hospital in critical conditions while four others to a private clinic.

Border belt in Mymensingh will be brought under tea cultivation

A vast tract of land of the border belt in Mymensingh region will be brought under tea cultivation programme by Bangladesh Tea Board (BTB).

BTB will take up such a programme to meet the growing demand in local markets and to increase the export volume.

According the experts, the weather and soil condition in the border belts of Mymensingh region which include Mymensingh, Sherpur, Jamalpur and Netrokona districts are similar to the tea producing area of Sylhet region and the future of tea production is bright

More than 15,000 hectares of land would be brought under tea cultivation here, experts said.

Recently a team of BTB conducted a feasibility study on tea cultivation in Nalitabari, Sreebardi and Jhenaigati upazilas of Sherpur and Haluaghat upazila of Mymensingh. During their survey the BTB team found that the soil, climate and rainfall in the areas are favourable for good tea production. The team also found that "Indicator Plants" locally now as "Nishi Gachh'

Move to demolish property of Muktijoddah Sangsad

Bangladesh Tea Board will set up demonstration plots for starting massive tea cultivation and to attract the farmers towards tea cultivation. A proposal has been sent for introducing small holding tea cultivation here to the Ministry of Commerce for

When contacted, some farmers of Haluaghat upazila told The Daily Star that they are very interested to start tea cultivation because it is much more profitable than that of traditional crops. They said that if tea cultivation is stared here in small scale, one day it would flourish as tea industry because there are thousands of hectares of fallow forest lands in the border belts of Mymensingh region where tea cultivation can be expanded fast.

Thousands of hectares of fallow forest lands under the Department of Forestry can be brought under tea cultivation. As a result good foreign exchange would be earned while thousands of unemployed people would be employed in the neglected
