Leaders, MU drop points

Liverpool missed out on the chance to regain the lead at the top of the English Premiership after they were held to a goalless draw by struggling Sunderland at Anfield on Sunday.

Despite dominating the match throughout Liverpool could not force a goal and fine saves from Austrian keeper Jurgen Macho and spirited defending denied Gerard Houllier's team all three points.

The result meant Liverpool stayed in second place, a point behind leaders and reigning champions Arsenal.

Elsehwere West Ham rescued a 1-1 draw against Manchester United in the closing stages, struggling Bolton inflicted a 4-2 home defeat upon Leeds, Everton continued their winning run with a 1-0 win away to Blackburn and nine man Fulham held on for a goalless draw

against Birmingham.

Liverpool's failure to score capped a frustrating week for the Merseyside club who on Tuesday went out of the Champions League to Swiss side Basel, having sustained their first Premiership defeat of the season against Middlesbrough last weekend.

But Houllier insisted: "The game against Basel was more frustrating we had more chances then. Sunderland rode their luck, and their defending was heroic at times.

"Their goalkeeper was probably man of the match and made some good saves. I can't ask for more from my players

Sunderland manager Howard Wilkinson, whose team are just outside the relegation zone in 17th place said: "The target is 40 points. Until we get that we can't look at what's next. I hope that will come sooner rather than later. Every point

Proud West Ham managed Glenn Roeder said: "Our supporters kept us going but we gave them plenty to cheer.

But the under pressure boss readily acknowledged James' contribution. "When a keeper makes saves like that it's the equivalent to a goal at the other end."

Kadhafi may

buy Lazio!

A consortium led by the son of Libyan leader Moamer Kadhafi is considering buying cash-strapped Serie A club Lazio, Italian news agency ANSA reported Sunday. ANSA said Al-Saadi Kadhafi had

sent them a statement saying the Libyans were evaluating a bid to become the major shareholder of the Italian First Division outfit.

Lazio's future was plunged into doubt earlier this week when Cirio, the debt-ridden company owned by club president Sergio Cragnotti, announced it would have to sell its stake in the club. The board of the canned food

giants also said it may have to ffload its other businesses as part of a restructuring programme.
Cirio's has debts of around 150

million euros leaving many to fear that Lazio will founder like former Serie A outfit Fiorentina, who were demoted to the third division after amassing huge debts Al-Saadi Kadhafi recently

became a board member of Italian champions Juventus after the Libvan Arab Foreign Investment Company (LAFICO) bought a share

Kadhafi, who plays for the Libyan national football team, has a deal with Lazio to use the club's Formello training ground for which he is believed to have paid more than

'No thanks' says Anelka

The French soccer federation may ask Premier League Manchester City to ban Nicolas Anelka for two matches after he turned down a call-up for Wednesday's international friendly against Yugoslavia.

"The French federation is considering asking Anelka's club to ban him for two matches." a French media officer said in a statement on Monday. "It's the federation's rule

in such a case and a plea could be sent to the English soccer federa-

"If no sanction is taken we will put the case to FIFA."

France coach Jacques Satini said he had learned of Anelka's decision in the newspapers. "If he doesn't turn up here the

sanction will be implemented. It's not up to me, it's the federation's rule. There are some values and

duties I abide to and some players don't have the same values," Satini told a news conference at the team's training camp at Clairefontaine outside Paris

"Everyone is responsible for his deeds. It confirms the character of this player."

The sports daily L'Equipe said on Monday Anelka had flown in to Charles de Gaulle airport late on Sunday to tell reporters about his refusal, which could spell the end of his international career.

"I met the coach last week when we played Manchester United and I was not convinced by what he said", Anelka was quoted as say-

Santini wanted to compensate for the possible absence of Olympique Lyon's Sidney Govou, who sustained a thigh injury during a league match against Girondins Bordeaux on Saturday. "I have a feeling that this choice

is being in a way forced upon (the coach), while I need to be accepted by all the squad's members to feel at ease", said Anelka, who did not tell Santini about his decision, but informed several France team

Anelka, who has won 28 caps, had not played for France since the goalless draw against Russia in a World Cup warmup match at the Stade de France in April.

The 23-year-old striker who joined City after a disappointing spell of six months with Liverpool last season had been overlooked by former coach Roger Lemerre for the World Cup finals.
