The High Court yesterday issued rule upon the government to show cause in 10 days why the detention of Bahauddin Nasim, assistant political secretary to former prime minister Sheikh Hasina, should not be declared illegal.

### Pak 'drug trafficker' dies in city

An on-trial Pakistani national arrested on suspected involvement in drug trafficking died at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) Saturday night

The dead, M Ibrahim, 40, son of one Mosai Khan of Khejuri than of Teogia in Peshwar, was one of the three arrested from Room No. 906 of the Hotel Razmoni Isa Kha at Kakrail in the city on September 20, 1999.

Tipped off, a team of Department of Narcotics Control (DNC) arrested Ibrahim and two others - Alekzan from Peshwar and Rais Khan from Karachi - while they were about to hand over 24.1kg heroin to buyers.

The heroin - worth about Tk 25 crore - was the biggest-ever haul the DNC has made.

The three were believed to be members of international gang of drug smugglers

A case was filed against them under Narcotics Control Act.

Sources said Ibrahim was admitted to the DMCH for operation on November 21 as he was suffering from infection in his leg.

Ibrahim's body was kept in the DMCH morgue after autopsy yesterday.

Sources said the Pakistan High Commission in Dhaka was informed about the death.

The original law, enacted on April 11. 2001, made it mandatory for the government to publish district-wise lists of the returnable vested property within 180 days. But, the government failed to maintain the deadline due to unavoidable reasons, said the statement on the bill's

aims and objectives. The second amendment to the law says that the deputy commissioners would control the vested property to be listed and would lease those out unless returned to the owners.

Objecting to the introduction of the bill, Awami League (AL) lawmaker Suraniit Sengupta said the proposed amendments would allow the government to take unlimited time to return the vested property. "In fact, the government is going to make the law 'clinically dead'."

Land Minister M Shamsul Islam, who moved the bill, said the AL government had framed the law in such a way so that it never came into force. "You (Sengupta) made the law, but never enforced it," the minister pointed out.

gated on October 24, a week into the anti-crime crackdown across the country.

The presidential ordinance became ineffective as soon as the speedy trial tribunal bill was passed. This is the second law of its kind

that aims at combating certain crimes since the government of Prime Minister Khaleda Zia assumed office more than a year

According to the new law, the tribunal would only try criminal cases of listed categories to be transferred by the government through gazette notification.

The tribunal, to be headed by a judge with the rank and status of a district judge, is to complete a trial in a maximum of 135 days. The court would initially have a 90-day trial period. It may at first be given 30 more days if the trial was not complete due to unavoidable reasons.

The trial period may be extended by another 15 days on valid reasons. In both cases, the court has to inform in writing the Supreme Court and the government of the reasons

for extension of time. On expiry of the 135-day trial period, a case would be sent back to the court from where it had been shifted with a notification on noncompletion of trial. In that case, the latter would dispose of the case on a priority basis.

The speedy tribunals will follow the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) unless it contradicts the new

The tribunal will go for a summary trial of a case unless the punishment is death sentence or life imprisonment or jail-term exceeding seven vears.
