



Crime gangs in Ctg bought 100 AK-47s from Arakan rebels

Around 100 AK-47 rifles reached different gangs of criminals in the port city and its surrounding areas from the insurgents of Arakan state of Myanmar staying in deep forests across the Bangladesh border, sources in intelligence agencies said.

Arakan insurgents sold the rifles and some other sophisticated weapons to these gangs through a clandestine channel of local kingpins of arms dealers and smugglers on various occasions in the past few years.

Intelligence sources and many others believe that some AK-47 rifles were also supplied to gangs operating in the capital and other parts of the country.

With the launching of the nationwide anti-crime drive by the joint forces, most of the kingpins of arms dealers and smugglers have gone into hiding and others have fled to Singapore, Hong Kong, India and some other countries.

During the on-going drive, six AK-47 rifles and other sophisticated weapons have been recovered from different hideouts in Chittagong and Cox's Bazar.

Some notorious criminals in the port city and nearby Fatikchhari and Raiganj areas reportedly procured AK-47 rifles to show their strength to their rivals and dominate them, police and other sources said.

Despite knowing this, police hardly raided their

hideouts.

Besides, smuggled arms find their way into Chittagong and Cox's Bazar through sea route. Those arms are mostly offloaded from cargo ships at the outer anchorage of Chittagong port and mechanised boats carry those to the shore in Chittagong and Cox's Bazar, sources said.

Three security guards at the port arrested during the on-going drive gave important information about arms smuggling and the kingpins involved in it. Those are not being disclosed now in the interest of further investigation, officials said.

A leader of dock workers, Jahangir Alam alias dock Jahangir, was arrested as per confessional statement of the arrested security guards during interrogation. Two of his (Jahangir) brothers went into hiding to escape arrest.

Meanwhile, mystery still shrouds the dropping of 250 boxes of 'smuggled goods' (suspected as arms) into the sea from a mechanised boat at the outer anchorage towards the end of 2000.

Intelligence sources said a kingpin of a smuggling racket, who hails from southern part of Chittagong, owns industries, a palatial hotel in the port city's Agrabad area and became director of a private bank, was involved in that case of smuggling.

Sumi Khan was taken to the police station from her office-cum-residence at Patharghat at around 4:00 pm on Thursday. She was interrogated twice by senior officials of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP).

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, Sumi said, "This was simply to harass me and members of my family unnecessarily to serve the

Peace sans democracy not attainable

Hasina tells Delhi convention

UNB, Dhaka

Opposition leader Sheikh Hasina yesterday called for upholding democratic values and norms all over the world to attain peace and development, forsaking arms buildup and war.

"Peace is not mere absence of war... Without democracy peace is not attainable... But democracy becomes meaningless if the toiling millions suffer from poverty, disease, hunger and dehumanising conditions," she said.

Delivering a keynote speech on "Non-violence and Peace" at a convention in New Delhi, Hasina said poverty alleviation, eradication of social injustice, economic and

social development and empowerment of women are more important than acquiring sophisticated weapons and preparations for war.

Ela Gandhi, granddaughter-in-law of Mahatma Gandhi, and South African Deputy Defence Minister Nozizwe Mandla-Routledge were among others who spoke at the four-day convention sponsored by Nonviolence Peaceforce at Hotel Rajhance at Surjikund, about 40 miles of the Indian capital.

Hasina said: "Today we perhaps live in a world more dangerous than at any other point in time in the recorded annals of mankind."

She noted that an unbelievable stockpiling of arms and ammunition

2 accomplices of Liaquat arrested

The army arrested 128 people including 26 "listed criminals" from different parts of the country during the last 24 hours ending at 8:00 am yesterday.

They include most wanted criminal Liaquat Hossain's close accomplices Abdus Salam and Zakir of Dhaka and "top criminal" Benazir of Rajshahi, wanted in 13 criminal cases.

Salam and Zakir were arrested in a raid in New Eskaton area in the city yesterday morning.

The army also seized seven pistols, five revolvers, five shotguns, three pipe-guns and 391 bullets during the period.

Maria's killers yet to be arrested

Police are yet to arrest the killers of Maria, the two-and-a-half-year-old girl who was killed during a bomb attack in the city's Sutrapur area Wednesday evening.

Despite several drives at different points in the city over the last two days, police failed to find any of the six people accused of killing the child, Sutrapur thana police told The Daily Star last night.

Minutes before iftar on Wednesday, a gang of criminals chased Maria's father Faruk, a police informer, and hurled several bombs at him. One of the bombs hit Maria in the head, killing her instantly and injuring her father. Faruk had
