Manchester United's needs were briefly well served last season by the part league, part knockout format of the Champions League until Bayer Leverkusen rolled the Premiership giants over in the semifinals

United were twice outplayed by Wednesday's opponents Deportivo La Coruna in the opening group stage - a Fabien Barthez howler in the first match at Old Trafford helping the Spaniards on their way.

But come the knock-out phase it was United who turned the tables with a 2-0 away win in Spain knocking the stuffing out of the Galicians, who then fell 3-2 at Old Trafford in the quarter-final return.

"We won the ones that mattered," as United boss Alex Ferguson dryly noted. United are now hoping to take

their Spanish sequence to 3-2 in their favour on home soil - and should David Beckham make a return from a rib injury Ferguson will expect his side to add three points to those garnered against FC Basel in their opening second phase match.

Two wins going into the tournament's winter break would be a sizeable Christmastime fillip for the back-in-form Red Devils, who could then tackle Juventus in back-toback encounters on resuming Champions League action in mid-February.

Defender Rio Ferdinand is also making good progress from a thigh muscle injury and Ferguson says both men could be in the frame to start the Group D match against Javier Irureta's men.

Should Beckham return he is unlikely to face the man who almost ruled him out of the World Cup -Argentine Aldo Pedro Duscher, who broke the United star's foot with a



US plans of Barca, MU, Juve

Three of Europe's biggest football clubs -- Barcelona, Manchester United and Juventus -- are teaming up for a pre-season tour of the United States to open new marketing opportunities and promote the sport there, the Spanish club said.

The Catalan club said that the 11-day tour, which has been arranged as part of its strategic alliance with American Football's National Football League (NFL), would include a match against Juventus in Boston on July 27 and one against Manchester United in

Philadelphia on August 3. The opponents and venue for a third match to take place on July 30 have yet to be confirmed. "The tour forms part of the club's

commercial strategy which is designed to open up the United States market," read a statement on the Barcelona website

"The tour will represent an important source of revenue in terms of television rights, sponsorship and marketing." The club said that the tour's

official presentation will take place during Super Bowl XXXVII in San Diego on January 26. Barcelona entered into a three-

February with the two bodies agreeing to work together to support each other's operations on either side of

the Atlantic, each promoting the other in their own countries. Barcelona agreed to support the Spanish City's NFL Europe team the

Dragons, and the NFL have helped Barcelona schedule their tour which will take place at American football stadiums

The strategic relationship was the first between a major American sports league and a leading European soccer club although Manchester United and the New York Yankees baseball team unveiled a similar business link-up year partnership with the NFL last last year
