Alok Kapali is fast developing a reputation as Bangladesh's most reliable batsman

The 18-year-old right-hander from Sylhet was initially picked in the Bangladesh team more for his leg spinning ability for the second Test against Sri Lanka at the SSC ground in Colombo early this year. However, it is his batting that has stirred the imagination of everyone.

In his debut Test, Kapali gave an indication of his promise with a polished 39 in the first innings. He then added another useful 23 in the second innings in an otherwise forgettable Bangladeshi batting

Kapali further enhanced his credentials in the highly demanding tour of South Africa last October. While others around him were clueless against the formidable pace attack of the home side, the little man stood tall with crucial facesaving knocks of 35, 10, 38 not out and 23 in his four outings in the But it was in the just finished

home series against the West Indies that Kapali announced his name as a batsman of international pedigree.

After cracking his maiden oneday international fifty in the 3rd match, Kapali reached another landmark when he scored his first Test half century--52 in the first innings of the first Test in Dhaka. And yesterday, the unassuming

young man sent the Windies bowlers on a leather chase during a wonderful second innings 85 Interestingly, in each of those three occasions, Kapali's score was the highest of the Bangladesh innings.

A gifted leg-side player, Kapali is far from one dimensional as he demonstrated yesterday with some exquisite cover drives and square cuts. But the shot of the match was a pulled six off a barely short of length delivery from the high-flying Vasbert Drakes.

"The coach told me not to shy away from playing shots today so I went along with my natural instincts. That freedom also gave me a lot of confidence," said Kapali.

Ronaldo was named FIFA World Player of the Year for an unprecedented The award capped a remarkable year which saw the Real Madrid striker

Named European Player of the Year on Monday, Ronaldo added the global award to add to the crowns he won in 1996 and 1997.

The buck-toothed goal getter was the clear choice of the 148 national team coaches who voted, with 59 first place votes and a total of 357 points, which was more than twice those polled by his nearest rival, Germany and Bayern Munich goalkeeper Oliver Kahn.

Kahn, who was tormented by Ronaldo during the World Cup final which Brazil won 2-0 thanks to his brace of goals, came second with 16 first place votes and a total of 171 points.
