

'You are nothing without your teammates'

After being awarded FIFA World Player of the year 2002 for the third time (1996, 1997 and 2002), Real Madrid's Brazilian superstar Ronaldo faced the press on Wednesday in his very own humble style and answered every question with trademark honesty and modesty. Question (Q): Despite not being 100% fit all the season, did you expect this nomination?

Q: Do you agree with the absence of Italian players for the top awards?

R: We are going to fight for all the competitions. The Champions League and the Spanish *Liga* are our objectives right now, and I think we are capable of winning both of

R: Unfortunately, what is happening at the stadiums is horrible and it is damaging our sport. Football is very beautiful thing, you just have to go to the field and enjoy

R: We players have to get rid of these things. There are some footballers that try to cheat taking these substances. For me, thank God, the people that are by my side have never let me down, they take

R: I cannot mention only one of them, they all have been very important

Real Madrid's centenary year celebrations ended on a high note when the team fought back from 3-0 down to draw 3-3 with a World Selection in an ultimately thrilling friendly at a rainswept Santiago Bernabeu stadium

It finally came three minutes from the end when Esteban Cambiasso scored with a brilliantly struck curling shot from the edge of the box to give the reigning World Club and European champions a well deserved draw after creating eight clear-cut chances in the last 20

The World Selection took the lead after 30 minutes with a superbly executed header from Klose, who scored five goals for Germany in the World Cup finals. He connected with a perfectly

Bellamy banned for three games

Newcastle striker Craig Bellamy has been banned for three Champions League matches for violent conduct after being sent off against Inter Milan last month, UEFA said on Wednesday. Wales international Bellamy, 23,

responded to a shove from his marker Marco Materazzi with a petulant kick at the defender and received his marching orders in the fifth minute of the 4-1 home defeat on November 27.

Bellamy can appeal the ban, which would rule him out of three of Newcastle's final four second phase Champions League matches which resume against Germany's Bayer Leverkusen on Feburary 18, till midnight on Saturday.

Unfair allocation?

FIFA's shake-up of World Cup qualifying for the 2006 tournament shows soccer's governing body is more interested in a geographical spread of competitors than having the best 32 teams at the finals.

The new allocation of places raises the prospect of holders and five times champions Brazil missing out altogether while all but guaranteeing Australia, who did not win a match in their sole appearance at the finals, a place in Germany.

No country from outside Europe and South America has won the World Cup but it was those confederations which lost a half place -- a play-off against a country from another region -- in Tuesday's reorganisation

"They couldn't beat us on the field so they've done (so) on the table," South American Football Confederation (CONMEBOL) spokesman Nestor Benitez said. summing up the surprise and upset

in the region at FIFA's decision. UEFA are reduced to a substantial 13 representatives plus 2006 hosts Germany, but South America, which has provided the winners of nine of the 17 World Cup tourna-

the finals. The beneficiaries of the reallocation were CONCACAF, the North and Central American, and Caribbean Confederation, who now have three and a half spots, and Oceania - guaranteed a place in the finals for the first time.

With Asia (4-1/2 places) and Africa (5) keeping the places they had, the new allocation looks to be an improvement when viewed solely in geographical terms.

Looked at in terms of footballing pedigree, however, the changes can be seen in another light by comparing the prospective paths to the finals of Brazil and Australia.

It was the loss of the automatic berth for the previous Cup winners that allowed the shake-up. Brazil must now take their chances with nine other South American nations tion for one of its four places at the

Quality runs through the South American competition -- even the one-time whipping boys from baseball-mad Venezuela have improved -- and it was only a late run of form which allowed the Brazilians to qualify outright last year in fourth

That left twice world champions Uruguay, who finished fifth, to take on Australia over two legs for a place in the finals, which they successfully negotiated.

It was not Australia's first defeat at the final hurdle -- they had lost to Iran and Argentina to miss out on the 1994 and 1998 finals -- and their inability to get past the playoff prompted Oceania's intense lobbying for a guaranteed place.

By contrast to Brazil, Australia's route to their playoff defeat by Uruguay last year took in five matches against fellow members of the Oceania confederation.

They won all five, scored 72 oals, conceded one and registered 31-0 and 22-0 victories over American Samoa and Tonga respectively. Australia -- where soccer comes

fifth behind cricket, Australian Rules and both codes of rugby as the sport of choice -- are ranked 50th in the FIFA rankings, well behind six of the South American

To get to Germany, Australia may once again have to ease past the hapless American Samoans, who are the third worst team in the world, according to FIFA's rankings. In one of the quirks of the FIFA


