million US dollars in 2015. An UNFPA estimates said the costs of supplying enough condoms would rise from 297 million US dollars in 2002 to 557 million in 2015 to address the HIV/AIDS pandemic in these countries. Therefore, the amount of money the developing countries need to provide will be 1,067 million US dollars in 2015.

Meanwhile, UNICEF's State of the World's Children report dis-

closed here that as many as 6,000 children and young people around the globe were being infected with HIV everyday.

estimates also said. The Population Reports observed that inadequate fund from the donors for contraceptive would threaten contraceptive security in the developing countries, unless their own family planning programmes were strengthened and the private sectors' involvement expanded.
