Roma sail on Samuel

Walter Samuel struck a 46th minute goal to give AS Roma a 1-0 win at Torino on Saturday, a victory which moves Fabio Capello's team into eighth place in Serie A.

However, Roma, the 2001 champions, were also indebted to goalkeeper Ivan Pelizzoli who saved a Christian Lucarelli penalty in the 10th minute of the match as Torino eventually crashed to their 11th defeat in 14 league matches this

Argentina for Brazil

Brazil would be the best country to host the 2014 World Cup if the tournament was awarded to South America, the president of the Argentine Football Federation Julio Grondona said on Saturday.

"I don't think Argentina will be nominated. Brazil have not staged the tournament since 1950 and we organised it in 1978." Grondona told local radio. But he added that if Brazil were

not to organise the tournament, then Argentina would be willing to do so possibly in partnership with Chile or Uruguay.
With the 2006 finals being

staged in Germany and the 2010 event promised to Africa, the 2014 tournament could return to South America if the prestigious competition is rotated around the various confederations. South American confederation (CONMEBOL) officials have been

lobbying hard for the FIFA to commit to staging the 2014 World Cup on the continent but FIFA president Sepp Blatter said the issue was not up for discussion when the world governing body met in Madrid last

"The principal of rotation (of the World Cup) between continents has been established and the 2010 World Cup will be staged in Africa,

"There had been a CONMEBOL proposal that wished South America to be considered for the 2014 World Cup but this was not heard," he added.

Blatter confirmed there were three official candidates for the 2010 World Cup, Libya, Morocco and South Africa but further nominations could still be put forward until the end of the year.
