Unidentified miscreants threw acid on three persons of a family, including a 21 days old baby, leaving them seriously injured at a village in Tala upazila of the district recently.

Police and family sources said Noor Islam, 28, his wife Khodeza Khatun, 18, and their daughter Sonali of village Noakati sustained serious burn injuries in the acid attack.

The miscreants threw acid on them through the window of their house when they were asleep. They were first admitted to Tala Health Complex and then shifted to Khulna 250-Bed Hospital. The reason behind the acid throwing could not be known. A case was filed with

Tala police station in this connection.
