## White's WC hope clouded

England's in-form all-rounder Craig White has a torn side muscle and is expected to be out of cricket for six weeks putting him in doubt for the World Cup.

White, strapped up and batting with painkillers, was England's top-scorer with an unbeaten 85 in their first innings of 270, but not enough to avoid the follow on against the Australians in the fourth Boxing Day Test at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Saturday.  
The 33-year-old Yorkshire all-rounder afterwards revealed he had torn a side muscle while bowling in the Australian first innings on Thursday and would take around six weeks to recover.  
He said as he couldn't bowl he was doubtful to play just as a batsman in next week's final Sydney Test.  
"I stiffened up during the day and bowled a fair few overs and just after tea I bowled a bouncer to Damien Martyn and felt a little burning sensation in the side... it got worse during the day," White said.

## Ashes over for Lehmann
