






Australia have their eyes on a rare Ashes series clean sweep after beating England by five wickets in the fourth Test here Monday despite the tourists putting up their best scrap of the summer.

The world champion Australians had freewheeled to three massive wins to clinch the series after just 11 playing days and expected much the same in the fourth Boxing Day Test, yet the anticipated final day formality turned into a gripping

Entering the fifth day requiring 99 runs for victory, England's two pace bowlers, Andy Caddick and Stephen Harmison, gave the beleaguered tourists a sniff of a miraculous victory, much like the tourists' come-from-behind win at the Melbourne Cricket Ground four years ago.

England, who fought bravely through Michael Vaughan's 145 to take the Test into a fifth day, had the

Aussies teetering at 90 for five and

still 17 runs adrift of the target. The Barmy Army supporters were roaring at the prospect of a cherished victory over their Ashes tormentors. It was compelling theatre as the Australians were drawn into a desperate struggle.

In the end Australia had five wickets to spare as Adam Gilchrist clouted the impressive but erratic Harmison for four to reach the

Victory in Thursday's New Year Test at the Sydney Cricket Ground will secure Australia a 5-0 Ashes series sweep, the first since Warwick Armstrong's men achieved the feat over England in Australia in

World divided over Zimbabwe boycott

Australia's Prime Minister John Howard has joined Tony Blair's call for a cricket World Cup boycott of Zimbabwe as the row over its cohosting of the event intensified.

Zimbabwe chief government spokesman Jonathan Moyo responded by saying Britain and Australia wanted to keep "cricket white" by pulling out of matches there.

"If the British and the Australians want to keep cricket as a white and colonial sport, then they should do so alone because we are not interested in their rubbish," Moyo told the official Herald newspaper on Monday.

"This is obviously not about safety and security, it is just political mumbo-jumbo," Moyo added.

Zimbabwe received support on Monday from Pakistan and World Cup organiser Dr Ali Bacher of cohosts South Africa while the Australian and English team captains have called for politicians,

rather than players or administra-

tors, to make the final decision. Blair had confirmed his government was opposed to England playing there but had no power to ban them and would leave the final decision to the English cricket board


