Essentials dear in dists

Prices of essential commodities have shot up in Kushtia and Gopalganj districts bringing more hardship to people of low income group.

A correspondent from Kushtia reports: Prices of different kinds of rice increased alarmingly in Kushtia. Coarse rice is being sold at Tk 13-15 per kilogram (kg) as against Tk 11-13 a few days ago. Medium quality rice is being sold at Tk 15-16 kg. Super quality rice including Nazirsai, Minicata and some other varieties are on sale varying between Tk 16-20 and Tk 21-23 respectively.

Prices of winter vegetables have also shot up sharply. Brinjal is being sold at Tk 16-15 per kg. Bean is selling Tk 10-12 kg. Price of tomato has jumped to Tk 16-18 per kg from Tk 10-13 a few days ago. Potato is now on sale at Tk 14 kg while previously it was being sold at Tk 10-12. Cauliflower and cabbage are selling at Tk 12-13.

Leafy vegetables are on sale at Tk 10-15 per kg.

Different kinds of pulses like 'moog', 'musur', 'motor', 'chhola' are being sold Tk 40-46 per kg.

Soyabean is selling at Tk 48-54 per kg while mustard oil is on sale at Tk 65-70 per kg. Kerosene is being sold at Tk 24-26 per kg.

All kinds of fishes are now out of the buying capacity of common people. Ruhi fish is on sale at Tk 100-140 per kilogram, Katla at Tk 60-80, Koi at Tk 250 per kg.

Mutton is on sale at Tk 140-150, beef at Tk 70-80 a kg, chicken including broiler and non-broiler at Tk 65-70 and Tk 100 respectively.

UNB from Gopalganj reports: Price of cylinder gas has increased by Tk 100 in last two weeks in Gopalganj district while diesel per liter by Tk 4.

Each litre kerosene is being sold at Tk 22 against the previous price of Tk 17, petrol at Tk 35 against Tk 28, soyabean oil at Tk 54 against Tk 44, per kg Irri rice at Tk 13 against Tk 11, black cumin at Tk 36 against Tk 28 and pulses at Tk 46 against Tk 36.

The prices of other essentials are also on the rise causing concern among the common people.

One jailed for filing a false case

The Speedy Trial Court, Magura on January 19 sentenced a complainant to two years imprisonment.

The court also fined the convict Tk 5,000, in default, to suffer one month more in jail for filing a false case against 10 persons with a motive to harass them.

Magistrate Khan Nurul Amin sentenced Khokon Chakrabarti for filing a false case accusing the people of looting his shop after its damage.

In the case filed with the local Speedy Trial Court Khokon Chakrabarti alleged that 10 persons including Nannu Sikder of Niznandali area in Magura town looted his shop after damaging it on April 25, 2002.

After judicial and police investigation the case was found false and it was filed against the accused following a feud in the area.

Later Nannu Shikder, on behalf of the accused, filed a case against Khokon Chakrabarti for harassing them in a false case. The court asked Khokon to reply why legal action would not be taken against him.

As the reply was not satisfactory, the court awarded the punishment to him and ordered the authorities concerned to send him to jail.

School will be used as cyclone centre

10,000 needy families to get Caritas help
