Septuagenarian killed

UNB, Barisal
A septuagenarian was killed and six other people were injured in an attack allegedly by his son-in-law at Shakunia in Bakerganj upazila on Tuesday.

Locals told UNB that when Motahar Boyati went to plough a disputed land in the morning his father-in-law Akram Howlader, 70, along with his family members tried to resist him. At this he became furious and attacked them killing the old man on the spot.

Body of boy exhumed

UNB, Chandpur
The body of a minor boy was exhumed after six days of his burial at Alipara village in Faridganj upazila on Monday.

According to the prayer of his parents, the body of Shahadat, 8, was exhumed in presence of OC Saiful Islam and Magistrate Selina Begum. Locals said the next door neighbour Firoz Alam Hiron called Shahadat out of his house in the name of plucking mango on May 20 but he did not return. Later, his body was found in a pond and was buried.

Body recovered

Police recovered the body of Riazuddin, 40, of village Hasna in Hossainpur upazila from a field on Tuesday. The body bore marks of stab injuries.

Wife beaten to death for dowry

A housewife was beaten to death allegedly by her husband for dowry at Samuk Khola village in Islampur union under Balakandi upazila recently.

Police said, Morzina Khatun, 18, was fatally injured as she was beaten by her husband Abdur Razzaq and members of his family. She died at Rajbari Sadar Hospital.

Man stabbed by tenant

A man was stabbed seriously allegedly by his tenant at Kalibari in Nabiganj upazila on Monday night.

Police and locals said tenant Satyen Dev took an attempt to kill his wife Shefali, 30, when he came to know about her extra-marital affairs with the owner of his house Shangkor Dev.

But hearing the hue and cry of Shefali's four-year-old daughter Shangkor came to the spot and tried to save Shefali. Satyen then stabbed him grievously.

College building under construction

PDB crackdown on defaulters, illegal subscribers in Ctg

The Power Development Board (PDB) has launched a crackdown on defaulters and illegal subscribers in the port city to realise outstanding bills.

It will realise Tk 200 crore to fulfill its revenue target for the remaining months (May-June) of the current financial year in Chittagong region, PDB sources said.

A PDB team, led by its Chief Engineer Liakat Hossain Barobhuiyan, is conducting the drive launched on Tuesday in

Hospital (CMCH), Chittagong City Corporation (CCC), Amin Jute Mill, Chittagong Steel Mill (now closed) and several other government and private institutions. Their dues total Tk 140 crore. PDB had set a target to realise Tk 685 crore during the fiscal year (2002-2003) but it realised Tk 500 crore till end of April.

PDB has 3.31 lakh subscribers in the region but the officials could not say how many of these connections are illegal.

Till April, over 9000 illegal connections were snapped, Tk 50 lakh fine realised and 1,800 cases were filed, the sources said.

Mohonpur UNO's removal demanded

Hundreds of people staged day-long demonstrations at Mohonpur upazila headquarters and a three-hour sit-in in front of the UNO office on Wednesday demanding removal of the UNO for alleged corruption in recruitment of school teachers.

Although police was deployed, the demonstrators hurled brick bats on the house of UNO (Upazila Nirbahi Officer) Mujibur Rahman.

Local leaders of BNP, Awami League and chairmen of the six unions under the upazila jointly led the agitation, alleging that the UNO took bribe in recruitment of teachers.

The demonstrators also held a rally. It was addressed by Mohonpur upazila BNP General Secretary Giasuddin, AL leader Ali Azmal Mollah, and the six chairmen -- Shamimul Islam, Abdul Jalil, Abul Hossain, Abdul Latif, Sadar Ali and Rabiul Islam.

When contacted, UNO Mujibur Rahman refuted the allegations. He said the agitation followed his refusal to appoint a candidate of UP chairman Shamimul Islam as a teacher of Moreshandi Madrassah in Gashigram union.

Nor'wester in Mymensingh: 20 injured

At least 20 people were injured when a nor'wester lashed Muktagacha, Phulbaria and Sadar upazilas of the district on Tuesday.

Roybeti on road to a new living

Roybeti Tripura, mother of four, no longer collects firewood from forest to sell those at a far away market, a risky job that kept her family half-fed.

The family is properly fed now and she thinks of sending her children to school.

She gets 3 kgs of rice and Tk 20 for three to four hours' daily work in the morning.

She is among 9100 destitute women, working under the Rural Road Maintenance Programme (RRMP) in Panchbari.

"I'm happy. May family gets food three times a day. I dream of sending my children to school", she told this correspondent last

week.

"Earlier I had to procure firewood from the jungle. That was very risky and had to spend almost the whole day. Now I have time to look after my children," she said.

The RRMP project, financed by the government and the World Food Programme (WFP), covers 675 km roads in Rangamati, Khagrachhari and Bandarban, said officials of the Local Government and Engineering Department, which is implementing it.

The first phase of the project, launched in fiscal 1998-99, has been completed.

The second was launched in June last year.

Killer-rapist to serve life term

The Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal, Khulna on Monday sentenced one Md. Ismail to life term and fined him Tk one lakh for killing an eight-year-old girl after rape.

Judge Mohammad Shahinur Islam ordered handing over the money to the parents of the victim, Khadija, who was raped and killed by Ismail at his house at Moilapote on the night on October 4, 2000.

Khadija had gone to neighbour Ismail's house to view television. But she did not return home.

On the following morning, Khadija's body was recovered from the bath room of an underconstruction building adjacent to Ismail's house.

Her mother Sufia Begum lodged a case with Sonadanga thana accusing Ismail for raping and murdering Khadija.

Feni traders observe strike

Traders at Feni observed a two-hour strike on Tuesday protesting the killing of businessman Kamal Uddin and demanding immediate arrest of the culprits.

Feni Town Businessmen Association called the strike from 10 to 12 am.

They held a protest meeting on the trunk road, which was addressed by, among others, Ziauddin, Faruque, Harun, Dr Arun Chandra Das, Abdul Gofran Bachhu.

The meeting followed a procession in the town.

The meeting demanded arrest of the killers within 72 hours and threatened of a greater movement if non-compliance.

Kamal Uddin was murdered by unidentified miscreants on Sunday at his village home at Elashpur.

FF Matlib's killer to die in Sylhet

Four others get life term

One person has been sentenced to death and four others given life term for killing a person in Kanaighat for appearing in court as witness in an arms case.

The Additional District and Sessions on Tuesday sentenced Mainuddin, 55, of Daukergul village in Kanaighat to death for killing freedom fighter Abdul Matlib in 1995 by firing shots. Two others--Abdul Haque and Nur Hossain--were also injured.

Those given life term are Kalachan (absconding), Harun, Habibur Rahman and Manik Miah (absconding).

The killing incident had created resentment in the area.

Abul Hossain, nephew of Abdul Matlib, filed a case with the Kanaighat thana on March 6, 1995. Police submitted charge sheet against the 13 on June 27, 1996.

10,000 children left out of polio vaccination

Cop murder at Khulna trade fair: 6 charged

Six persons have been charged in KMP Traffic Sergeant Arif murder case.

Three of charged are absconding.

The police sergeant was killed in a bomb attack on the night of March 1 while he was on duty at the International Trade Fair at the circuit house ground.

It has been stated in the chargesheet that murder of Arif was sequel to a dispute over possession of a cycle garage near the fair.

The accused are Sujon, Hari, Rob, Abdul, Milon and Siraj. Of them, Abdul and Sujon made judicial confession under Section 164 in the court.

The loss of Arif's pistol during bomb attack has not been mentioned in the charge sheet, submitted by SI Hsana Hafizur Rahman who investigated the case.

Meanwhile, the case regarding murder of Dainik Purbanchal crime reporter Shaikh Harun has been included in the list of sensitive cases, prepared by the home ministry's monitoring cell, sources said. Higher authorities have sought the case dockets, they said.

CID has listed the case as 'most sensitive'.
