'Birth registration can help improve health services'

Health services could be provided for the rural mothers and children in a better way under the existing government budget if births are registered timely and expectant women undergo checkup regularly, a Japanese health

specialist said here on Thursday. Ito Hiromi of Japanese Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCV) said the regular statistics of mothers, expectant women and babies could not only help arrest mortality, but also promote the immunisation programme among the rural poor.

Exchanging views with a group of journalists at the office of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) at the IDB Bhaban,
