JS passes bill for reforms in law for women, children

The Jatiya Sangsad last night passed two bills bringing in major reforms in laws concerning women and children repression and provisioning some measures for quick dispensation of justice.

The bills are The Prevention of Women and Children Repression (Amendment) Bill, 2003 and The Code of Civil Procedure (Amendment) Bill, 2003.

While the first bill provides for, among other points, punishment to provocateurs of suicides, the second one significantly enhances fines for certain offences to curb the trend of filing false cases and gives the district judges the power of case revision.

Besides, The Code of Civil Procedure (Amendment) Bill, 2003,

also provides that no ad-interim or temporary injunction against government's dévelopment activities could be served without hearing the government.

With the passage of the Prevention of Women and Children Repression (Amendment) Bill, 2003, the age of child (in the definition of a

Coast Guard in action SHAZNEEN CASE Dr Kamal blames to flush out criminals from Sundarbans

The Coast Guard on Saturday launched a major combing opera-tion in the Sundarbans, which has become a safe haven for pirates and smugglers, to flush out criminals from the famous World

The operation dubbed 'Golden Tiger' and involving a 600-strong joint forces of the Coast Guard, Navy, paramilitary BDR (Bangladesh Rifles), police, Ansars and VDP (Village Defence Party) will be the first of its kind to arrest hardcore criminals who have long stripped the forest of its precious

Ten ships and a number of speedboats have been requisitioned to carry out the joint opera-tion, said a senior official of the Coast Guard.

According to sources at the eastern and western wings of the Sunderbans Forest Division, the government has been losing huge revenue earnings due to rampant pillage of forest wealth by armed bandits who operate virtually unchallenged due to absence of any effective countermeasures.
