50 pc brickfields set up in 2002 illegal

Air quality has improved following intensive drive: DoE

The number of illegal brick-fields had come down significantly during the past six months leading to a gradual improvement in envi-

The reduction in the air polluting unauthorised brick-fields was attributed to an intensive drive by the Directorate of Environment

Authorities had taken drastic action against the illegal establishments during 2003 bringing down the rate of pollution in the air, the DoE sources said.

Illegal brick-fields had been halved in one year following the drive, the sources said.

Disaster Forum, a voluntary organisation, in a recent report, said almost 50 per cent of the 2684 brick-fields were set up in 2002 without any permission from the authorities concerned creating serious environmental pollution.

The report said the brick-fields are operating without proper permission as owners are influen-

tial people. In most of the cases, the owners run a good number of brick-kilns though they have permission for only one.

The number of illegal brickfields was over 1000 last year which could be reduced to a significant number following the special drive, sources said.

The recent drive was launched following widespread pollution created by the brick-fields. The brick-fields use leather, burned lubricants, tubes and other pollutants as fuels.

The emission of poisonous gas caused deadly diseases like respiratory problem and skin diseases to the inhabitants of the areas.

The report said most of the illegal brick-fields did not use the specified 120 feet chimney. As a result, the poisonous gas spread to the breathing air circulation of the inhabitants of the area, it said.

The DoE was now encouraging friendly block bricks, manufactured by computerised machines

Petroleum dealers refute adulteration charge

Leaders of petroleum dealers and filling station owners yesterday refuted the allegation of fuel adulteration levelled at them, terming it 'sweeping' and 'one-sided'.

At a press conference, leaders of the Bangladesh Petroleum Dealers and Tank-Lorry Malik O Sramik Sangram Parishad also demanded equal prices of diesel and kerosene to check adulteration.

They said fuel is carried from its original source to different depots of B a n g l a d e s h P e t r o l e u m Corporation's (BPC) three companies Padma, Meghna and Jamuna either by waterway or by railway or

"We bring the fuel to the filling stations from the depots in tank lorries," Sajjadul Karim said.

"And fuel adulteration does not take place at the filling stations, but at its source, if at all," he added.

On the move to privatise petro-leum sector, Sajjadul said that it would bring about a disaster if not done in consultation with the business community concerned, who have extensive practical experience in this regard.

Bangladeshi brigade joins UN force in DRC

The first 140 UN soldiers of a brigade from Bangladesh have arrived in the battled-scarred town of Bunia in northeast Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), a UN official said Tuesday.

"For now about 140 have arrived, but they are still coming, said Leo Salmeron, spokesman for the UN's military mission in DRC, called MONUC.

Some 3,800 Bangladeshi troops are expected to join MONUC's Bunia contingent by September 1.

As well as about 700 Uruguayan military guards deployed under MONUC in the town, around 1,000 mostly French troops are there under the flag of the European Union to protect civilians from inter-ethnic clashes that killed hundreds of civilians


