

Barca leading the race?

Paris St-Germain president Francis Graille today claimed that Barcelona have moved ahead of Manchester United in the never-ending race to sign Ronaldinho.

The bid from the Catalan club, claims Graille, is "completely" superior to the offer from United, and the PSG president added that he is keen to get the sale done as soon as possible.

Even though Barcelona have proposed the inclusion of two players as part of their bid - which is believed to be around £21m - PSG are warning that United must move swiftly to increase their £15.5m bid, and do so significantly, in order to remain in the race for the Brazilian.

Asked whether the offer from Old Trafford was insufficient compared to the sum which Barca are prepared to pay, Graille said: "Yes, completely. However nothing has been done yet."

Graille wants the situation resolved "as soon as possible", and the longer Barcelona's bid remains the preferred option for PSG, the more likely they are to sign the striker.

When asked whether there were meetings planned with United chief executive Peter Kenyon, Graille added: "Nothing has been planned so far but things can happen very quickly."

Barcelona have made Ronaldinho their prime target since losing out on David Beckham to Real Madrid, and their new president Joan Laporta is eager to secure a big-name signing - both to improve a team which last season

descended into mediocrity, and to increase the club's worldwide profile.

Laporta stated Wednesday he has no intention of getting into a

bidding war with United for Ronaldinho.

"Barcelona tabled a significant offer to Paris Saint-Germain and at the last moment, when we were on

the point of signing contracts, Manchester United came in with a counter bid and sparked off a bidding war," said Laporta.

"We don't think it's in Barcelona's interests to up our bid to Manchester's level, which, it seems, is very high," he added.

"Barcelona made a sizeable offer and will stick to it," said the Catalan club's boss, and that "the matter is now closed."

According to Laporta, Barcelona's sporting vice-president Sandro Rosell went to Paris on Tuesday to reach an agreement with Ronaldinho and his agent and brother Roberto Assis.

The latter, talking to AFP by telephone Wednesday afternoon, declined to comment on the state of play in the negotiations. According to him, Ronaldinho is still in Brazil.

Ronaldinho has said that he wants to join United but he and brother Roberto Assis, who acts as the 23-year-old's agent, are understood to be disappointed by the protracted nature of the transfer.

He is also known to be enthusiastic about playing in Spain, but would have preferred to join Madrid rather than Barca, only for the team from the Spanish champions to withdraw their interest when Ronaldinho dismissed their suggestion that he should stay at PSG next season on a loan basis.

PSG have stopped Ronaldinho's wages and he remains in Brazil - seven days after he was due to report back for pre-season training.

Ronaldinho is best known for his 40 metre free kick which fooled England goalkeeper David Seaman in the World Cup quarter-finals.

Kleberon deal on the cards

Manchester United were expected to complete the signing of Brazil's World Cup winning midfielder Kleberon later Thursday.

Media reports said the 24-year-old had left Sao Paulo for Manchester where he was due to pass a medical.

United manager Alex Ferguson said two days ago he hoped to make

Kleberon the first Brazilian to play at Old Trafford in a reported seven million pound (11 million dollar) move from Atletico Paranaense.

United also hope to wrap up a 19.3 million pound deal (31 million dollar) deal with Paris St Germain for their Brazilian world champion Ronaldinho later this week.

Ferguson sees the pair as an ideal replacement to England captain David Beckham who moved to Real Madrid.

Kleberon, linked with Leeds and Newcastle in April, began last year's World Cup on the bench before replacing Juninho and establishing a match-winning partnership with Gilberto Silva, now playing for Arsenal.

Chelsea getting Duff

Damien Duff is winging his way to Chelsea after a £17million deal was struck as he prepared to jet to America.

Duff was boarding a plane at Manchester Airport to head off on Blackburn's pre-season tour to Washington.

But then Rovers accepted Roman 'Chelski' Abramovich's FOURTH mega-bid for the Republic of Ireland wing wizard, who did a swift about-turn and dashed off for talks.

The Londoners are also waiting to see if a £14m offer for Deportivo La Coruna striker Roy Makaay will be successful.

Bayern Munich had hoped to land the Dutch ace for £12.5m, but Chelsea aim to pip them by including Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink in their package.

Makaay is currently thinking over his future on holiday in Holland. He is believed to favour a switch to England rather than Germany because that is what his wife would prefer.

Duff can look forward to a double-your-money pay deal of £70,000 a week to join Red Rom's Stamford Bridge revolution.

The 24-year-old ace has been claiming he would prefer to stay at Ewood Park. But new Chelsea owner Abramovich is not used to rejection and the player knows he cannot afford to snub this chance-of-a-lifetime transfer.

Duff's exit for the capital will be a blow to Manchester United, who had also been after him.

He will join £6m West Ham and England Under-21 full-back Glen Johnson and £6.9m midfielder Geremi in the Londoners' new-look squad.

Duff's ability to create goals would be perfect for 28-year-old

European Golden Boot winner Makaay, who hit 42 goals last season including nine in the first two phases of the Champions League.

Deportivo would love Chelsea's latest free-kick king, but cannot afford his £70,000-a-week wages.

To help out and speed up business, Abramovich has offered to pay the player's salary for his first year in Spain. Hasselbaink, 31, is said to be happy to return to the country where he banged in 30 goals for Atletico Madrid before joining Chelsea in June 2000.

Abramovich has moved for Makaay because he now knows Christian Vieri is unlikely to leave Italy and Patrick Kluivert is staying at Barcelona.

Bayern already look resigned to losing out to the man with the fattest cheque-book in football.

Angry coach Ottmar Hitzfeld

insisted: "We are in the comfortable position that we have enough top strikers even if Makaay won't come."

Geremi is poised to become Chelsea's latest free-kick king, having completed his move from Real Madrid last night.

The Cameroon international, 24, has a five-year contract and is already dreaming of replacing hot-shot Gianfranco Zola.

Geremi told Chelsea TV: "I know Zola was one of the finest at delivering set-pieces. But I will do my best to do the same."

There was further good news for the club when Eidur Gudjohnsen signed a new three-year deal.

Midfielder Jody Morris, 24, will join First Division new-boys Cardiff today on a Bosman free.

Heading for Highbury?

Milan want Motta

European Champions League winners AC Milan are stepping up the chase to sign Barcelona midfielder Lolo Motta, according to Wednesday's Gazzetta dello Sport.

The newspaper reported that Milan vice-president Adriano Galliani and director Ariado Braida have flown to Spain to try and thrash out a deal for the 20-year-old Brazil international.

The Gazzetta said Milan are prepared to offer the Spanish club either former Italy international Demetrio Albertini or Brazilian defender Roque Junior as part of a deal to take Motta to the San Siro.

Albertini, 31, recently returned to Milan after completing a one year loan with Barcelona's Spanish rivals Atletico Madrid, while Roque Junior, a member of Brazil's 2002 World Cup-winning squad has failed to hold down a regular place in Italy under coach Carlo Ancelotti.

Motta joined Barcelona as a 16-year-old and made his Primera Liga debut in October 2001 against Real Mallorca.

A string of impressive performances in the reserves soon saw Motta selected for the first team and he made several appearances for Barcelona in last season's Champions League.

He is currently in Mexico with the Brazil squad competing in the CONCACAF Gold Cup.

Eriksson to give Becks time

England coach Sven-Goran Eriksson says captain David Beckham may sit out the upcoming friendly against Croatia to give him time to settle at new club Real Madrid.

The tie, scheduled for 20 August, is a warm-up for the Euro 2004 qualifiers with Macedonia and Liechtenstein but Beckham may be rested for the clash at Portman Road.

"We haven't made any decisions about David yet," Eriksson declared on the Football Association website.

"But we'll see how things go for David and we'll make that decision just before we pick the squad."

Beckham, who recently swapped Manchester United for the Spanish capital in a 25 million pounds deal (40million dollars), missed England's last qualifying match against Slovakia through suspension.

Eriksson is keen to monitor the progress of Beckham in Madrid with speculation mounting as to where he will play.

"It will be very interesting of course to see what position he will play," said an intrigued Eriksson.

"I don't need to see him every week, but Tord Grip (Eriksson's assistant) and myself will travel to Madrid to see him."

Geremi relishing the prospect

Cameroon international midfielder Geremi said he was targeting winning several Premiership titles with cash-rich Chelsea after completing his 7million pounds (11.1million US dollars) transfer from Real Madrid on Wednesday.

The 24-year-old signed a five year contract after passing his medical becoming Chelsea's second signing - Glen Johnson having signed on Tuesday - since Russian oil billionaire Roman Abramovich bought the club for 140million pounds a fortnight ago.

Geremi had been a target of Chelsea manager Claudio Ranieri last year but a shortage of funds prevented him from signing him and he went to Middlesbrough instead on loan where his impressive performances were a big

reason they weren't involved in their perennial relegation battle.

"I'm very happy to come and play for one of the biggest teams in the Premier League," Geremi told Chelsea TV.

"I've got a lot of ambition and I would like to win a lot of titles if it's possible - and that's why I've come here."

"Chelsea want to sign big players and that is good for us - when you play with big players it is much easier. They can understand everything."

"You have to work hard and try to improve every day. Now let's see what will happen."

Geremi enjoyed a successful time at Real Madrid winning the 2000 Champions League and the 2001 league title and was also a member of the Cameroon team that won the African Nations Cup and the 2000 Olympics title.

Costa Rica, Cuba in last four

Costa Rica blanked Cuba 3-0 here Wednesday to capture Group D in the Gold Cup football tournament and avoid playing host United States in the quarter-finals of the 16-nation event.

Walter Centeno scored in first-half injury time, netting a 16-year

volley off Carlos Castro's corner kick. Steven Bryce scored in the 72nd minute, only seconds after entering the match, and Erick Scott added a goal in the 77th.

Costa Rica, Cuba and Canada all finished round robin play 1-1 with three points. But Costa Rica's plus-2 goal difference won the group. Cuba advanced with two goals to Canada's one after both had a minus-one goal difference.

Costa Rica booked a Saturday quarter-final date against El Salvador, which beat Martinique 1-0 on Marvin Gonzalez's goal in the 76th minute. Both clubs had been winless in Group C round-robin play.

The defending champion United States won Group C after a pair of 2-0 victories and will face Cuba for a berth in the semi-finals.

Davids unlikely to move

Chelsea transfer target Edgar Davids is to see out the final year of his contract with Juventus and could extend his stay with the Italian champions, according to the Dutch midfielder's agent.

"Edgar is tied to Juventus for another year and he will stay in Turin," Robert Geerlings told Thursday's Gazzetta dello Sport.

"There is still no sign of life at Juve, but there is absolutely no problem for us," he said of a delay in being offered an extension of his current contract.

"We are waiting for their eventual offer which we will have to evaluate. There is no rush, everything is fine, as always."

Juventus turned down a bid from big-spending Chelsea for

Davids last week.

"It's true we have received an offer from Chelsea but we refused it," Juventus' general director Luciano Moggi said.

"Davids is staying because he is important for the club's future."

According to media reports Chelsea offered 11 million euros (12.46 million dollars) for the dynamic 30-year-old Holland international.

The English Premiership club have been linked with a batch of star players since they were bought out by Russian oil tycoon Roman Abramovich, including Arsenal duo Thierry Henry and Patrick Vieira, Manchester United's Juan Sebastian Veron and Inter Milan striker Christian Vieri.

The wealthy Russian has said he wants to build a Chelsea team capable of winning the Champions League in the next three years.

Kewell's muted debut

Australian international Harry Kewell made an uninspiring debut for his new Premiership side Liverpool here on Wednesday as the English club ran out comfortable 3-1 winners over Cologne.

The 24-year-old had only started training four days ago after his protracted and controversial 5 million pound (8m US dollars) transfer from Leeds which has sparked a FIFA investigation.

Kewell came on in the second half but was subjected to a joke at his expense as Michael Owen pretended to put on the famed number seven shirt - worn by former Liverpool legends Kevin

Keegan and Kenny Dalglish and which has been promised to the Australian.

However there was little of Keegan or Dalglish about his first two touches which saw him give the ball away, the second one almost leading to a goal for the German side's Andrey Woronin.

Liverpool manager Gerard Houllier said that because of his lack of training time it was understandable that Kewell hadn't been at his best.

"You have to take into account that he joined the squad late," the Frenchman said.

"But he still worked hard," he added.

Owen scored two of Liverpool's goals while England strike partner Emile Heskey scored the other one.
