# City's second water treatment plant

The second phase of the Saidabad Water Treatment Plant will be built to meet the demand for water supply in the city, which is increasing at a rate of five per cent every year

Faced with an increased demand for water in Dhaka city, the Water and Sewerage Authority (WASA) is planning to construct an additional water treatment plant at Sharulia under Demra thana.

The second phase of the Saidabad Water Treatment Plant will be built to aim at meeting the demand of water supply of the city, which is increasing at a rate of five per cent every year.

The estimated cost of the proposed project is Tk 265 cr which is much lesser than the Saidabad Water Treat Plant because this one will use many of its existing facilities.

The Saidabad Water Treatment Plant (Phase-one) which was constructed at the cost of Tk 584 was inaugurated on July 27, 2002. After commencement, this plant injected 22.5 cr litres into the pipeline of Dhaka WASA.

The World Bank, the government of France and the government of Bangladesh jointly financed the Saidabad

Water Treatment Plant.

The demand of water is 160 crore litres a day for the city. WASA, which produce 145 crore litres a day, can barely meet the demand of the city.

"Even if the construction of phase-2 begins now it will take at least three to put its water into our existing pipeline," said another source at WASA on condition of anonymity.

Meanwhile, the project proposal of second phase Saidabad Water Treatment Plant was submitted to the Pre-ECNEC (Executive Committee of the National Economic Council) meeting for the approval last year. Then the meeting of pre-ECNEC in a resolution informed the WASA to look for fund of


"Following this instruction, we approached several foreign countries and donor agencies," said an authoritative source at WASA.

"The Danish government has already shown interest to finance the project. Now they are at the end of a feasibility study of the project. I hope they will inform us of the matter within two or three months," added the

The phase-2 project does not need to construct raw water intake pumping station and twin culverts which are mandatory for a water treatment plant because during the phase-1 construction, a number of facilities had been built for the second one. This project will also be able to use the canal at DND (Dhaka Narayangan) Demra) embankment of Saidabad Water Treatment Plant for its easy

"If we construct Saidabad phase-2 water treatment plant we only need to lay pipelines for eight kilometres. The encouraging aspect is that we will able to use 36 existing pipelines of the Saidabad phase-1 treatment plant," said a high official of WASA who preferred to be anonymous.

Once implemented, the phase-2 project will add 22.5 litres of water to the WASA's pipeline. The central part of the city old Dhaka, Shantinagar, Motijheel, Elephant Road, Tejgaon, part of Dhanmondi and Lalmatia will immensely be benefited from this

# Multi-storey parking in limbo

A major multi-storey car-parking project in the city's Dilkusha area, proposed by Dhaka City Corporation (DCC), is in limbo due to hesitancy on the part of one of the two

The proposed 18-storey building comprising office and carparking facilities will be built on a four-bigha\* plot of land. Carparking will take up eight storeys above ground and an additional three floors will be reserved underground for basement parking. The remaining ten stories above ground will be rented out as office

The land in question is owned by Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) and the Sadharan Bima Corporation, a government owned insurance company, who each own two bigha of land.

"The BJMC has agreed to provide its land to us provided we give them two floors of parking. But Sadharan Bima Corporation, under the commerce ministry, is still in a dilemma about offering the land to us," said a source from the Dhaka Urban Transport Pro-

"In fact, the concerned officials of DCC are not really making a great effort to procure the two bigha of land from the commerce ministry. Their idle attitude is therefore delaying the start of this car parking project. Had they tried honestly the project would have been underway," claimed a source from the Dhaka City Corporation

The Dhaka Urban Transport

Project, under the DCC, invited tenders from interested parties in June this year and was supposed to open the offers on July 20.

"We will have to inform the interested parties about the rescheduled date for the opening of offers through the newspapers, said the DCC source.

Meanwhile, the DCC sent a letter of intent to Belhas Accom, a Dubai-based construction firm, last month, awarding it the contract to build another multi-storey car park in the city's Motijheel

commercial area. This car-

parking-cum-office-building will be a total of 33 storeys. Yet a third multi-storey car park,
