Procter's father passes away

International Cricket Council (ICC) match referee Mike Procter will return home to South Africa following the death of his father, officials said on Sunday.

The former Test player was the ICC match referee for the first two days of play in the second Test in Cairns between Australia and Bangladesh this week.

"Procter will not take any further part in the match and will be replaced for the remaining days of the Test by former Australian allrounder and current Cricket Australia Code of Behaviour Commissioner Ron Archer," Cricket Australia said in a statement. Archer, who played 19 Tests from 1952-1957, was appointed to the interim position by Queensland Cricket at the request of Cricket Australia, with the selection sanctioned by the ICC and the management of both the Australian and Bangladesh teams.

Following the Test, it is expected that Indian ICC match referee Gundappa Viswanath will travel to Australia to oversee the three-match series of one-day internationals beginning on

Real Madrid have been winning few friends in China as the Spanish champions forced hundreds of eager fans to wait more than an hour in the pouring rain before stepping on to the field Sunday.

Real held off taking the main field at the Hongta Sports center where organizers had built a makeshift grandstand, choosing to practice on a neighbouring field that afforded no view to ticketholding Chinese fans.

Fans braved heavy rain for more than hour as Real ran through a series of drills before finally taking the main field at 11:00 am (0300 GMT) and exiting 45 minutes later.

"It was not good at all. It was much too short and I waited in the rain for more than one hour," said one angry young fan who had paid 250 yuan (30 dollars) for an entrance ticket to the see his

Real Madrid deputy general manager Emilio Butraqueno said bad weather was partly to blame, with the rain-soaked pitch undergoing damage from the continuous

"We're having a problem with the weather and field number four is being ruined," Butraqueno told reporters.


