# Lawyers to sue **Blair over war**

Top lawyers from Greece are filing a lawsuit with the International Criminal Court (ICC) in the Hague yesterday against senior UK offi-

They want to indict Prime Minister Tony Blair and other senior members of the UK govern-ment and military for allegedly breaching international law by attacking Iraq.

The lawyers, from the Athens Bar Council, say they have com-piled a dossier of "strong evidence" against the officials, including more than 20 alleged war crimes.

They include the killing of Iraqi civilians, depriving the population of drinking water in cities such as Basra, the destruction of food supplies and the bombardment of residential areas.

A senior member of the association told the BBC the information had come from a variety of sources including doctors and journalists who were in Iraq during the war.

He said the alleged crimes breached the statute of the International Criminal Court.

Among those accused with Mr Blair are Defence Secretary Geoff Hoon and the Foreign Secretary Jack Straw. The heads of the armed forces

### **Milosevic's** trial halted again

The war crimes trial of former Yugoslav president Slobodan Milosevic has been suspended again because he is ill, a judge told the United Nations court in The Hague.

"A report has reached us...of the illness of the accused in the deten-tion unit. A doctor is apparently on his way to see him...," presiding judge Richard May said yesterday, adding that doctors would submit a medical report later.

Milosevic's landmark trial for genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity in Bosnia, Croatia and Kosovo has been repeatedly interrupted by the accused's bouts of ill health since it began in February 2002.

When a wealthy Arab patient flew to Germany for medical treatment last year he arrived on his own jumbo jet filled with so many bodyguards, staff and family that he rented an entire luxury hotel floor for his month-long stay.

The man from Qatar was among the richest but hardly the only foreigner to get health care in Germany to avoid the rigors of entering the United States, where anti-terror vigilance since the Sept. 11, 2001 attacks has frightened many Arabs away.

German hospitals are reporting huge increases in the number of Arab patients since 2001 -- at the expense of US medical centres such as the Mayo Clinic and Johns Hopkins that they compete with in the \$2 billion international patient industry

Health care officials said Arabs patients are turning to Germany

Germany is gaining pace as Arab patients spread the word and help refute any notion of a gap in health treatment between the United States and European countries like Germany -- which was the case several decades ago.

"Germany has acquired an excellent reputation among Arabs and word is spreading fast that hospitals and doctors are first rate," said Ozan Samtimiz, medical manager at German Health, an agency that arranges treatment for Arabs. But he said the main issue for the trend to Europe was America's security obsession.

"When Arabs travel to the United States they're viewed as potential terrorists," he added. "It's very difficult, almost impossible, for them to get US visas. These people may be ill and don't want delays, don't want an interrogation by customs.

## Iraqi group threatens 'holy war'

A hitherto unknown group of Iraqi Muslim militants has warned in a video tape aired on an Arab television channel that they will fight a holy war" against US President George W Bush and his administration

"Bush, Rumsfeld and decision makers in the 'Black House' and in the Pentagon...we will shake the ground under your feet and we will send a fire upon you which only God can prevent," a masked man said on a tape aired on the Dubai-based Al Arabiva.

The man called his group the Salafist Jihad Group".

"America -- you have declared war on God's soldiers...you will have no security or peace of mind as long as you are an infidel and fighting a war against Islam and Muslims," said the man, standing amid a group of similarly masked men holding weapons.

He pledged to avenge the arrest of religious figures and Islamist activists in prisons all over the world including Iraq, the US base at Guantanamo Bay in Cuba, Morocco, Kenya, Egypt, Syria, Pakistan and India.

In recent weeks, many groups some saying they are Saddam lovalists and one claiming links to the militant al Qaeda network of Osama bin Laden -- have claimed responsibility for attacks on U.S. occupying forces in Iraq.

U.S. Deputy Defence Secretary Paul Wolfowitz on Sunday accused the Al Arabiya and Al Jazeera channels of biased reporting from Iraq, adding that Washington was talking to unnamed governments to try to get more "balanced" coverage.

West Bengal Forest Minister Jogesh Burman yesterday said, "It's necessary to have the census jointly, as tigers frequently cross over into Bangladesh.

The tiger count on the Indian part of the swampy jungles stretching over 4,200 square kilometres was 271 last year. But the count on the Bangladesh side of the forest with 4,800 square kilometres is not precisely known.

The decision on headcount came after a Bangladesh delegation visited West Bengal this year with a proposal of carrying out a joint census.

Burman said the initial round of discussion with Bangladesh forest officials yielded satisfactory results, but he did not specify when the joint census could begin.

Although the greater part of the Sundarbans falls in Bangladesh, the Indian part consisting of 53 islands is home to more tigers because of freshwater sources. UNESCO declared the Sundarbans a World Natural Heritage Site in 1985. The Sundarbans, the world's largest delta formed at the confluence of the Bay of Bengal and several rivers, including the Ganges and the Brahmaputra, is one of the last surviving natural habitats for tigers, some of them man-eaters.

A recent study shows the big cats were migrating to Bangladesh in search of water. Scientists studying the biosphere changes in the Sundarbans have found that the drying up of freshwater sources in the mangrove forest is not only forcing tigers to leave their habitat in West Bengal and move into Bangladesh, but also bringing large-scale changes to the flora pattern of the forest.

The UNESCO and the UN Foundation will pay \$125,000 for the preparation of the project that includes studying the behaviour of tigers and find out why some of them become man-eaters.

Man-eating tigers kill some 50 to 75 people every year on the Indian side of the Sundarbans.
