WTO presses for flexibility to ignite stalled trade talks

The World Trade Organization's leader urged trade ministers Monday to show more flexibility in stalled talks aimed at revamping the global trade system.

Ministers from 25 countries met in a downtown Montreal hotel to hammer out a consensus the divisive issues of farm subsidies and patented medicines for poor

The latest round of free trade

talks has made little progress since being launched in 2001 in Doha.

"We need more flexibility in the positions of countries. We need country members to be prepared to talk about some compromise. We need ministers to commit on a political basis to some of the key decisions in key areas," said World Trade Organization Director General Supachai Panitchpakdi.

"The ministers present could start igniting the negotiation pro-

Meanwhile, some 200 protesters earlier Monday were repelled by riot police from near the meeting site. They instead turned to target companies they say represent the worst abuses of corporate

They smashed the shop windows of a Burger King restaurant, a Gap clothing store and a shop of the Canadian clothier, Jacob. They also vandalized a few luxury cars.

Police made about 100 arrests during the course of the protests, which wound down after a few

Further anti-mobilization protests were planned for Tuesday and Wednesday.

Supachai noted the Montreal 'mini-ministerial" will be a gauge of "how far we can go in certain directions" ahead of the Cancun WTO summit in September, not a decision-making gathering.

Japan unemployment dips but optimism restrained

The number of employed, including self-employed, was up 380,000 year-on-year at 64.11 million, rising for the second straight month and prompting some economists to argue that economic conditions had, at the
