

River erosion to ease due to more sediment flow

Bangladesh would see a decrease in river erosion and an increase in land reclamation due to rising sediment flow into the major rivers, a leading morphologist said yesterday.

Workshop on
ICT for
teachers

The Aga Khan School, Dhaka organised a week-long workshop for incorporating information and communication technology (ICT) into the curriculum, says a press release.

Participants from East Africa, Central Asia, India and Pakistan joined the senior section teachers of the school at the workshop.

Fifty-four teachers took part in the training programme designed to make learning for students and teachers more exciting.

Azra Naseem, a faculty member from Aga Khan University-Institute for Educational Development, and two instructors, Henry Wilmer and Joshua Farber from the International Academic Partnership (IAP), conducted the workshop.

Both the institutions are partners with the Aga Khan Education Service in the professional development and training of teachers.

Haque Sarker, although the Jamuna had eroded 82,000 hectares of lands in past 30 years, only 12,000 hectares of land were accreted (land lifted from river) during the period.

He showed data that against 1,000 hectares of accretion in 15 years (1984-99), the Padma had devoured 26,000 hectares of land and against 500 hectares of accretion in 10 years (1990-99), the Meghna had eroded 11,500 hectares.

The Centre for Environmental and Geographic Information Services (CEGIS), an independent analysis wing of the water resources ministry, organised the seminar at the BRAC Centre.

Presenting a paper at the seminar on the morphological evolution of Jamuna, Padma and Meghna, the morphologist said rivers tend to erode riverbanks when flow of sediment from upstream decreases.

According to Sarker, dearth of sediment from upstream accelerates the celerity of down-bound water in sloppy and braided rivers, resulting in massive bank erosion.

"The braided river-systems of Bangladesh annually erodes large areas of floodplains making thousands of people homeless. Severe bank retreat associated with widening of the major rivers has caused

great sufferings," said Sarker.

Dr Ainun Nishat, water resources expert and country representative of the International Union of Conservation of Nature (IUCN), stressed on further studies on the behaviours and courses of rivers.

Director General of the Water Resources Planning Organisation (WARPO) Dr Mosaddak Faruq and Executive Director of CEGIS Dr Riaz Khan also spoke at the seminar.

Chief of the Air Staff Air Vice Marshal Fakhrul Azam attended the ceremony as chief guest and distributed certificates among the passed-out student-officers of the course.

Student-officers included one from Bangladesh Army, one from Sri Lanka Air Force, one from Indian Air Force, one from Royal Malaysian Air Force, one from Royal Saudi Air Force and 13 from Bangladesh Air Force.

UITs starts functioning in September

One more private university is going to launch its academic programmes in September.

"The vision of establishing the University of Information Technology & Sciences (UITs) is to bring about a holistic development of personality of students," said Vice-Chancellor (designate) Dr A Majeed Khan at a press conference yesterday.

The university has been set up to meet the growing need for quality education, its founders said.

Medium of instruction at the university will be English to enable its students meet the global standards and get them fit in the international job market, said Dr A Majeed Khan.

The university will induce a blend of liberal arts and technological skills in moulding the 'attitudes and aptitudes' of learners, he added.

The campus is housed in the PBL Tower on Kamal Ataturk Avenue in the city's Gulshan-2 area.

At present, the university has seven classrooms with 12 full-time teachers.

The university offers undergraduate BBA programmes in accounting, economics, banking & insurance, information technology, management and marketing.

It also offers B.A. in English

language and literature, B.Ed. in computer education, and B.Sc. in nursing and community health, electronics and communication engineering, and computer science and engineering.

The admission tests will be held on September 4 at seven different venues across the country, and its first academic session is scheduled to begin on September 14.

All CU examinations under grading system postponed

The Chittagong University (CU) syndicate has postponed all examinations and other related activities under the grading system till September 10.

A decision to this effect was taken at an extra-ordinary meeting of the syndicate held at the VC's office on Wednesday night.

Presided over by Vice Chancellor Prof AJM Nuruddin Chowdhury, the meeting began at 3.00pm and ended at 12.00 mid-night.

The meeting, however, did not take any decision over the cancellation of the grading system in evaluating the answer script.

Campus sources said the syndicate waits for some official formalities to cancel the grading system.

The syndicate has sent back the matter to the dean offices concerned for a primary recommendation. If the deans of the faculties concerned recommend, then it will be sent to the planning committee.

The planning committee will then refer it to the academic council for its approval.

After these formalities, the issue will be placed again before the syndicate for final decision.

When contacted, a syndicate member and Assistant Professor SM Nasrul Quadir told The Daily Star that the syndicate has the power to take any decision but it does not want to dictate. If other

bodies recommend then the syndicate would take ultimate decision.

Meanwhile, students of the Institute of Forestry and Environmental Science (IFES) have also launched a movement demanding the cancellation of the grading system.

Due to their movement, the syndicate has also postponed all IFES examinations till September 10.

Earlier, following a series of

movement, the university authorities had assured the striking students that the system would be cancelled only for three academic sessions of 1998-99, 1999-2000 and 2000-01.

However, the authorities are willing to keep the grading system in marking the year final examinations from 2001-02.

The students of the university are now split into two groups. One group

belonging to these three academic sessions has postponed their movement while the other group who were admitted in science faculty in 2001-02 session had launched a fresh movement demanding the total cancellation of the grading system.

The agitated students of the 2001-02 session on Wednesday night assured the science faculty students of 2001-02 session that the grading system will also be cancelled for them.

When contacted, a senior teacher of the law department said the university authorities might have to face a legal hazard if they cancel the grading system and revive the old class system.
