## Rokan divulges judge's name

President of Supreme Court Bar Association Barrister Rokanuddin Mahmud yesterday named Syed Shahidur Rahman as the judge to have allegedly taken money from a person for fixing bail.

Rokanuddin in a letter to Chief Justice (CJ) KM Hasan yesterday disclosed the name of the judge and the evidence he has against the judge. He met the CJ at his residence after Hasan asked him on October 6 to garnish facts about his allegations.

Shahidur applied for a two-month leave yesterday.

"My letter contains the name of Additional Judge Syed Shahidur Rahman and details of his corruption," Rokanuddin told journalists at his chamber at the Supreme Court but refused to elaborate on the content of the letter.

"This judge, appointed on April 24, was rumoured to be a corrupt person. He should not be allowed to sit in the court after his name has been revealed. Lawyers have been aggrieved and I

Absence of written order led to anthem glitch

Technicians could not play the national anthem on audio at the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association conference, as the parliament secretariat did not inform Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre in writing beforehand, sources said yesterday referring to preliminary finds of a probe body.

The three-member inquiry committee, formed by Prime Minister Khaleda Zia on October 7, also talked to Deputy Speaker Akhter Hamid Siddiqui who gave a statement to the body.

"The committee is trying to find out the reason the national anthem could not be played during the conference," the deputy speaker told newsmen after one-and-a-half-hour talks with Chief Whip Khandakar Delwar Hossain, head of the committee.

The body will have to complete its investigation by today as it was asked to submit its report by October 16 -- the new deadline set after it failed to wrap up its probe in 48 hours.

The probe body that interrogated 11 officials, including the parliament secretary on Tuesday, may submit its report to the prime minister today.

OIC set to come up with Iraq document

## Govt takes steps for one-stop land registration

### Landowners to pay tax to bank from January

Landowners in six upazillas under six divisions will be permitted to pay their land development tax in commercial banks from January 1 under reforms aimed at simplifying the land law.

The government is also working to introduce a one-stop land registration service under the initiative instead of the present system that requires one to rush to three relevant offices.

The upazillas where the tax could

be paid to commercial banks are: Sylhet sadar, Hatazahari in Chittagong district, Shilpapur under Narasingdi district, Barisal sadar, Satkhira sadar and Pabna in Rajshahi district.

Landowners will also be permitted to deposit land tax in advance for the years to come.

Under the planned one-stop service, three offices -- the survey office, the circle office of revenue and the sub-registrar office -- will be combined into one so that people

## Graft eats away 5pc of public buying budget

Corruption eats up 10-15 per cent of the country's \$3 billion public procurement budget, leading to the loss of scarce resources and the deterioration of the investment climate, World Bank and ADB officials told a seminar yesterday.

"Pervasive rent-seeking and corruption produce kick-backs, ranging between 10 and 15 percent," said ADB representative Peter L. Peterson at a National Seminar on the Public Procurement Regulations 2003.

Speaking at the inaugural session, Acting World Bank head Mithinder S Mudahar said over the years the public procurement system suffered from opaque procurement practices, a lack of transparency and inadequate accountability mechanisms, including rent-seeking practices.

This situation leads to wasteful use of scarce public resources, domestic or borrowed. At a more fundamental level, it causes erosion of public confidence and adversely affects the national investment climate, he observed.

The success of the reforms in public procurement depends not only on the government's political will but also on support from the employees, Mudahar added.

The Central Procurement Technical Unit of the Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation Division (IMED) of the Ministry of Planning organised the seminar at the Bangladesh Institute of Administration Management

Foundation. IMED Secretary Manik Lal Somadikchaired the inaugural session.

State Minister for Finance and Planning Anwarul Kabir Talukder attended the seminar as special guest.

Speaking at the seminar, Anwarul Kabir Talukder said the time has come to fight unitedly against corruption. "Corruption will reduce if there is a combined effort," he said.

The state minister termed the formulation of the public procurement regulation a major reform, adding that it was done in a relatively short time.

In his speech, Peterson said good practices reduce costs and produce timely results; poor practices lead to
