College teacher murder

Protest rally, procession in Gaibandha

People brought out a procession and held a rally at Palashbari upazila headquarter recently demanding punishment of the killers of college teacher Shafiqul Islam.

Islam, a teacher at Basudebpur College, was stabbed to death and his motorcycle snatched by miscreants on October 22 evening while he was returning home in Digholkandi village.

A memorandum was also submitted to the Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) for its onward transmission to the Prime Minister for arrest and punishment of the killers.

The processionists paraded streets chanting various slogans.

Meanwhile police arrested two persons -Chand Mia and Rashedul Islam connection with the murder.

Police said they gathered information including names of the killers from confessional statements of the two arrested persons but declined to disclose their names for the sake of investigation.

Opposition conspiracy harming nation

BNP leaders tell Krishak Dal conference

Being rejected by people, Awami League is now engaged in conspiracy to defame the government and sabotage its roadmap for development.

This is harming the nation, BNP leaders said at biennial conference of Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Krishok Dal.

They also launched a tirade against former president and Jatiya Party chief HM Ershad.

"Ershad migrated from India and can not claim to be a son of Rangpur," said Deputy Minister for Relief and Disaster Management Asadul Habib Dul.

"During his (Ershad) ten-year rule he did nothing for the people of

greater Rangpur. Even he did not declare Carmical College a university college," Dul.

The convention held at the Shilpokala Academy auditorium was also addressed by among others, State Minister for Agriculture Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, ex-MP and Nilphamari district BNP president Shahriar Islam Tuhin, acting president of central Krishok Dal Mozibur Rahman.

Convenor of the district Krishok Dal Farhanul Haque presided.

Alamgir alleged that the previous governments did not take any pragmatic step for development of agriculture and wellbeing of farmers.

It was late president Ziaur Rahman who introduced massive irrigation and launched a canal digging programme, which bene-

fited farmers, he said.

He urged the party men to remain alert against "conspiracies by those rejected by people".

He said the government has taken proper steps so that farmers can get fertiliser, diesel and other agri-inputs at fair prices.

They urged the people to rally round BNP, saying only this party can lead the country to peace and development.

They also bitterly criticised Awami League for calling 102 "popular" leaders of BNP "godfathers".

The conference formed a 71-member Rangpur Krishok Dal committee with Md Mohsin as its president and Farhanul Haq as general secretary.

Movement to protect park in Rangamati

An attempt by the municipal authority to construct a community centre inside the lone 2.5 acre children's park has evoked protests from the townspeople.

People from all walks of life and children joined a human chain and other programmes in the town on Sunday to protest felling of trees at the park for the planned construction.

The municipality authority started the work last week under a World Bank funded Municipality Services Project (MSP) to "create recreation facilities for urban children".

The planned community centre will cost Tk one crore, provided under the MSP.

"We want a modern community centre but a children's park can not be destroyed for this," said Sunil Kanti Dey, a senior journalist, who joined the human chain.

Global Village, an environmentalist organisation organised the human chain in front of the park.

Later, members of the organisation submitted a memorandum to the Minister of Forest and Environment through the Deputy Commissioner to protect the park for children.

Leaders of Global Village said hunger strike and other programmes will be organised soon to compel the authorities to abandon the plan.

When contacted, Rangamati Municipality Chairman Habibur Rahman said the park is being renovated to enhance recreation facilities for children. The planned community centre will not affect recreation facilities.

"Rather, we are creating walkways, erecting sitting places and umbrellas for visitors and removing unnecessary bushes," Habib said. He said the park had become a den of drug addicts and criminals.

Teenage girl's suicide

Victim's parents threatened to withdraw case

Parents of a teenaged girl who allegedly committed suicide after being humiliated by some local youths are being threatened to withdraw the case.

Halima Khatun, 14, of Dewli village in Mohammadpur upazila committed suicide on June 13 year after allegedly being humiliated by four local youths earlier on the day.

Before taking poison she told her parents that she was humiliated by Kairul, Alamgir, Manjur and Al-Amin of the same village.

Halima's uncle Faruk Molla filed a case with Mohammadpur police.

Her tragic end whipped up protests in the area and drew many political leaders, police officials and NGO activists to the remote village.

EU-sponsored farmers' confec told

Food output has to increase by 3m tons in 10 years

Kentschynsky jointly inaugurated the conference.

A farmer's conference was held here on Sunday with a call for more support to marginal farmers to increase their productivity.

About 200 farmers' representatives from greater Mymensingh and Rajsahi regions attended the conference, organised under a European Commission-funded project for farmers' awareness building and training.

CARE Bangladesh has been implementing the 5.5 million Euro project since 2001 in six districts - Sherpur, Jamalpur, Mymensingh, Kishoreganj, Rajshahi and Chapainawabganj -- to ensure food security for the hardcore poor of the region.

But the country needs to increase food grains production by another 3 million tons in ten years to ensure food security to the growing population, he added.

The Agriculture Minister urged the development partners, including European Union (EU), to extend more support to these programmes to ensure sufficient balanced food for the people.

CARE Country Director in Bangladesh Steve Wallace also addressed the function.

He said the LIFE-NOPEST Phase-II Project is considered to be one of the best projects under CARE's portfolio, contributing to bringing in sustainable development of farmers' communities.

Esco Kentschynsky said, "European Commission always puts emphasis on governance and human rights. And one of the aims of this project was to give voice to the voiceless."

Through this project, the farmers have the chance to organise themselves and stand up for their rights, especially land rights."

The farmers expressed the hope that if they get proper guidance and support they will be able to solve their problem in a sustainable way.

Police constable to die for killing woman

A police constable on Sunday was condemned to death by a court here for killing a woman.

Additional District and Sessions Judge of Habiganj Aminul Islam sentenced police constable Abdus Salam of Harasupur police camp at Teliyapara to death by hanging for killing a woman on May 25 in 1996. The judge gave the verdict after examining 22 witnesses and evidence on record.

However, the convict is absconding.

The convicted constable, while on duty, shot dead Nehar Begum, 28, of village North Surma under Madhabpur upazila whom he loved. The victim was a cook of the police camp.

5 get 17 years' RI for keeping illegal arms

Five persons have been sentenced to 17-year rigorous imprisonment here by a special tribunal for possessing illegal firearms.

Judge Mohammad Motahar Ali handed down the punishment on Sunday to Mahfuzul Haque alias Tiger, Gias Uddin Shimul, Shourav Hossain Kafil, Sarwar Jahan and Mohammad Manik.

Police arrested them with firearms from Kazirhat under Sonagazi upazila on December 5, 2000.

After their arrest, Officer-in-charge Subhash Chandra filed a case under the Arms Act.
