CNG AUTORICKSHAW IMPORT

Huda draws JS body flak over scam charge

Sub-committee formed to probe allegation of favouring one company

A parliamentary standing committee yesterday took a swipe at Communications Minister Nazmul Huda for what it said was corruption in import and distribution of CNG autorickshaws, an allegation he denied outright.

Members of the parliamentary

standing committee on communications ministry told a temper-high meeting at the Sangsad Bhaban that a CNG (compressed natural gas) autorickshaw sold at up to Tk 3.67 lakh, up from the actual price at Tk 1.67 lakh as a result of monopoly by Uttara Motors.

The parliamentary body accused the communications ministry of

favouring Uttara Motors, allowing it to have monopoly on the business, as the company is the sole importer of CNG autorickshaws.

"No anomaly crept into import and distribution of CNG autorickshaws," meeting sources quoted Huda as saying in defence. Uttara Motors, allowed to import SEE PAGE 11 COL 1

Eight killed in Manikganj road accident

UNB, Manikganj

Eight people, including an Indian national, were killed and two others injured in a road accident at Muljan in Sadar upazila on the Dhaka-Aricha Highway yesterday morning.

Police and witnesses said the accident took place at about 10:00am when a Manikganj-bound tempo, carrying 10 passengers, crashed into a coach, leaving six passengers of the three-wheeler dead on the spot and four others

Two of the injured died on the way to hospital.

Owners spring up as Buriganga gets dredged

Dredging of the Buriganga began last week amid claims of ownership of its banks, foreshores and even the

Scores of 'landowners' milled around the site with 'valid documents' to lay claims on the river as soon as a huge dredger anchored on the river near Waashpur and Basila

After several meetings with the BIWTC (Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation) officials, the 'owners' demarcated their land over large areas in and around the river with red flags and bamboo

The BIWTC engineers at the site said that the ownership claims would not affect the dredging plans,

down the river significantly. The Sub-assistant Engineer and Incharge of the dredging site Abdul Matin said they were dredging according to a hydrographic map prepared by experts.

On the land ownership claims and planting of red flags and the bamboo poles, he said that it was not necessary to have more than 'twenty or thirty feet' of open channel for smooth navigation.

Sources in the BIWTC said that the ongoing Tk 36 crore project to dredge about 30 kilometres of waterways and to build landing facilities along the Turag and Buriganga rivers is sure to face serious hurdles. An official of the Port Section of the Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority

BSF kills 2 villagers, trades fire with BDR

C'nawabganj tense

Two Bangladeshis were gunned down by the Border Security Force (BSF) of India near Chalkpara border under Shibganj uapzila in Chapainawabganj district Tuesday, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) sources

The dead are Afzal Hossain, 45, son of late Khorshed Ali and Matiur Rahman, 35, son of Mamtaj Ali of Chalkpara village.

The BDR quoted witnesses as

Sultanpur outpost in Maldah district entered the Bangladesh territory near the Chalkpara frontier at about 6:30pm and opened fire on the two while they were returning home form a bazaar. Both died on the spot. After the incident, the BSF per-

sonnel again opened fire on the villagers without any provocation, the sources said. Hearing the news, a BDR team

went to the spot. And both the BDR and the BSF were locked in exchange of fire that continued for

Export sector to get loans at 7pc

All banks yesterday promised to set lending rate for the export sector at 7 percent instead of the current 8 to 10

The Bankers' Committee at a meeting presided over by Bangladesh Bank (BB) Governor Fakhruddin Ahmed yesterday took The meeting held at the

Bangladesh Bank conference room also said the banks would not take the central bank's refinancing facility to lower the rate. BB Deputy Governor Nazrul

Huda speaking at the end of the meeting said banks will reduce the lending rate for certain priority

The interest rates on lending for

the agriculture and small- and medium-enterprise (SME) sectors are going to be pegged at 10 percent. Huda added that the meeting reviewed BB's intentions to reduce

lending rates to increase investment

He said BB cancelled a circular that was to be issued to reduce export sector lending rates to 7 percent as the banks themselves announced the reduction yesterday.

The central bank has warned the chief executives against their failure to pass any information about illegal bank transactions including hundi on to the central bank. It added that if any illegal transaction is to be found in BB inspection, then the CEOs will be held liable.

Vajpayee wishes to visit Dhaka

Indian Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee has expressed his willing-ness to visit Bangladesh at a convenient time.

Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan, at a press briefing at his office yesterday evening, said the Indian premier showed interest to visit Bangladesh at an exclusive meeting with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia on the sidelines of Saarc Summit in Islamabad

"The foreign minister-level meeting between the two countries will set the schedule of his arrival,"

Morshed said. Terming their exclusive meeting successful, the foreign minister said the two premiers, among other issues, discussed fight against ter-

rorism and water-sharing India has offered a \$150 million credit to improve Bangladesh's rail communications system, he said adding that it has also offered to provide two computers in each districts and a trained teacher to enhance computer literacy in Bangladesh.

Vajpayee thanked Khaleda for sealing the border when Indian forces launched an anti-insurgency drive in Bhutan two weeks ago Khaleda also said Bangladesh never allowed any Indian insurgents to operate inside its territory and it will never do so, the foreign minister

He also shared some important points discussed during the PM's exclusive meeting with Pakistani President Pervez Musharraf.

"Their talks focussed on widen ing mutual cooperation," Morshed said adding that they have also decided to increase the number of student scholarships.
