# Don't make mid-term duty change

### Revenue Reform Commission's report recommends tax, Vat net widening

The Revenue Reform Commission (RRC) strongly opposes any midterm duty change, typically practised by the government through issuance of SROs (statutory regulatory orders), and recommends widening the country's income tax

The RRC says only parliament should have the power to change duty, excepting for in the case of disaster management. In case of such emergency duty change, that should be approved by parliament within three months

The RRC yesterday submitted its report to Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman along with a set of nearly 500 recommendations on how to improve the meagre revenue earning and simplify the tax system so as to end harassment on the public. It also suggested forming a high-powered committee to implement the recommendations.

The 447-page report also suggests an increase in the income tax waiver slab from Tk 90,000 to Tk 100,000 a year.

The licence fee for TV, which is now collected annually, should be collected only once during the sale.

The RRC says the one-time licence should be Tk 1,500 for a colour TV set and Tk 300 for a black and white one. It also recommended no licence fee for radio

RRC Chairman M Mustafizur Rahman along with seven other members handed over the report in presence of National Board of Khairuzzaman Chowdhury and Finance Secretary Zakir Ahmed

"We will start implementing the recommendations in phases upon scrutiny," Saifur told journalists SEE PAGE 11 COL 4

"And that's why I declared that the Awami League would no more call hartal even if we return to the opposition. But after my announcement the BNP and other parties responded with more hartals," the former prime minister

# Ansars Naik shot dead in Bagerhat

dress hours before the killing.

The district was put on high alert following the murder of a member of the joint forces. Police picked up 64 persons for questioning and are on a combing operation to arrest the culprits, but no case was filed till 7:00 last evening.

Alamgir hailed from Satkhira and joined the joint forces from the ninth battalion in Madaripur. His body has been sent to Satkhira.

With the murder, four of the security forces members got killed in Bagerhat in the last 18 months.

### 20 DU students hurt in clash with DMCH staff

breakfast. One of them slapped a canteen boy for delay in serving food. The students then assaulted canteen managers Abul Hossain and Hasan Miah and started drag-ging away the canteen boy.

A group of class four employees at the DMCH then chased the students away, confined one of them named Faisal and beat him

On information, about 30 DU students rushed to the DMCH canteen and went on a rampage.

Nasa's new space telescope beams back new images

A new window to the universe opened with yesterday's release of the first dazzling images from Nasa's newly named Spitzer Space Telescope, formerly known as the Space Infrared Telescope Facility.

The first observations, of a glowing stellar nursery; a swirling, dusty galaxy; a disc of planetforming debris; and organic material in the distant universe, demonstrate the power of the telescope's infrared detectors to capture cosmic features never before seen.


