To do that, the Black Caps must exploit Pakistan's preference to play just five bowlers by seeing off the frontline pair Shoaib Akhtar and Mohammad Sami then launch into the rest of the attack.

Akhtar, the star paceman, reached 159 kilometres per hour in Christchurch and will be a big threat again on what should be another hard and fast surface.

"They've got three quality backup bowlers (Abdul Razzaq, Azhar Mahmood and spinner Shoaib Malik) but once you've faced 150-160kmh, you've got to be a pretty special bowler to then follow in because guys, if they get through it, are going to look to pick up the pace," Fleming said.
