The opposition leader also alleged that the ruling alliance men amassed crores of taka through corruption and siphoned those out of the country.

She pledged to realise all the money embezzled by the govern-ment and return those to people.

Hasina accused the ruling loyalists of damaging every sector, including education sector, through politicisation and nepotism. "Teachers of different educational institutions, including universities, are being persecuted by ruling party

Terming the BNP-led coalition 'a government without confidence', the AL president said, "They are aware of the fact that people did not vote them to power. So they have resorted to repression on the AL leaders and workers in a bid to eliminate the opposition.

She urged the teachers as well as commonman to unite against the misrule of the government and launch a tough movement to realise the 15-point demand.

Criticising the government ecision to close down several thousand satellite and community schools, Hasina said the government was shrinking the scope of primary education while encouraging private universities at the same time.

She said, "The previous government of the Awami League had a goal to eradicate illiteracy by 2006, but now the goal is a far cry due to wrong policies of the present government.

# Agri research agencies fail to kick off projects

UNB, Dhaka

Agriculture Minister MK Anwar has expressed annoyance at the failure of agricultural research agencies to kick off projects even after sanctioning of funds.

"Either do your work properly or quit." the minister was quoted as saying at the Governing Body meeting of the Bangladesh Agriculture Research Council (BARC) at its conference room here yesterday.

The ministry on an emergency basis released Tk 5 crore in December last year against a Tk 10 crore 'Action Plan' undertaken for the development of pulse, oil seeds and spices. But the project scien-tists told the meeting yesterday that they were not in a position to initiate the project in the current fiscal year due to seasonal varia-

Environment and Forest Minister Shahjahan Siraj and State Minister for Fisheries and Livestock Ukil Abdus Sattar Bhuivan also attended the meeting that coordinates works of 10 agriculture-related research institutes,

including those for forestry, fisher-

MK Anwar urged the agriculture scientists and extension workers to immediately take coordinated steps to reduce yield gap between research findings and actual field experiences.

He said, "Had we reduced the gap, the overall agriculture pro-duction would have increased by 10-15 per cent.

Three papers were presented in the meeting, reviewing the man-date, organisations and programmes of Bangladesh Livestock Research Institute (BLRI), Bangladesh Fisheries Research Institute (BFRI) and Bangladesh Forest Research Institute (BFRI).

Prepared by the scientists, sperts and teachers of the relevant fields, the reports assessed the ongoing research activities and recommended some future research issues. They also recommended change in organograms and recruitment rules of the insti-
