

AKC fans target photojournalists

A section of Abahani supporters yesterday verbally assaulted pho-tographers of different newspapers and threatened them with dire consequences during the Western Union Premier Division football league match between the Dhanmondi giants and Sheikh Russell Krira Chakra at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium.

It all started after Abahani's Russian striker Maxim was shown the red card in the 35th minute of the first half. As a furious Maxim made his way to the dressing room, photographers covering the game rushed to take snaps.

As they neared the corridor to the players' enclosure, a group of Abahani fans started hurling expletives and threatened the lensmen for taking Maxim's photos.

The insults continued to rain in for the rest of the game as the photojournalists started feeling insecure.

DMFLC to discuss MSC's fate tomorrow

Dhaka Mahanagari Football League Committee (DMFLC) is likely to sit tomorrow to decide the fate of the unfinished Western Union Premier Division Football League match between holders Mohammedan Sporting Club and Muktijoddha Sangsad Krira Chakra on Thursday.

The match was played for 86 minutes before Mohammedan, demanding cancellation of a goal against them, refused to play. The result was 1-1 at that time

According to a top DMFLC official yesterday, the organisers of the Dhaka Premier Division league are going to take proper action against Mohammedan as per the bylaws.

"We are going to consider it as a case of Mohammedan refusing to play. Besides, recorded clips in news channels have shown it clearly that it was a legitimate goal and everything happened infront of thousands of people. So, Mohammedan must face the consequences. They won't be given any privilege for being a big club," said a top DMFLC official opting anonymity.

According to the DMFLC bylaws, if any team refuses to play, the opponents are declared 2-0 winners and a points from their SEE PAGE 14 COL 4 overall collection is also forfeited.

South African captain Graeme Smith and opening partner Herschelle Gibbs slammed centuries as the West Indies paid dearly for a decision to bowl on the first day of the fourth and final Test at Centurion Park here on Friday.

At tea, Smith was unbeaten on 118 and Gibbs had made 102 not out as South Africa reached 241 for no wicket, a record opening stand for South Africa against the West Indies and the biggest partnership for any wicket in a Test at Centurion.

The left-handed Smith hurried his sixth test century off 125 balls, reaching the mark when an unusually subdued Gibbs was on

But Gibbs then unleashed some fluent strokes to notch his third century of the series and the 13th of his career shortly before tea. It took him 183 balls, with his second fifty scored off just 66 deliveries.

West Indian captain Brian Lara won the toss for the first time in the season and hoped his bowlers would exploit a pitch which had a green tinge.

The recalled Mervyn Dillon gained some early movement off the pitch and had Gibbs playing and missing several times, but his new ball partner Fidel Edwards was expensive and the batsmen were able to score freely.

The closest the West Indies came to taking a wicket in a first ession shortened by half an hour by morning rain was when Smith was stranded in mid-pitch after a running mix-up.

His score was on 23 and the total on 54. Ramnaresh Sarwan fielded at point and ran towards the stumps before flicking under-arm and missing from close range.

Smith had another scare on 89 when he top-edged a pull against Edwards but the ball just cleared a fielder positioned on the boundary and went for six. Smith went to his century with

Farris Khatib of Great Britain and Kartikti Bhat of India emerged boys' and girls' singles champions in the Rajshahi International Junior Tennis tournament yester day.

Gilchrist ravages Zim

World champions Australia found record-shattering form to once again outclass a struggling Zimba-bwe and record their third straight win in the tri-nation international one-day cricket series at Bellerive Oval here on Friday.

In the biggest one-day score yet on Australian soil, the hosts beat Zimbabwe by 148 runs.

Wicketkeeper and opening batsman Adam Gilchrist set the tone for the day when he blazed an incredible 172 from just 126 deliveries to set Australia on their way to a total of 344 for seven.

The tally edged out Sri Lanka's 343 for five against Australia last January as the highest interna-tional one-day score made in the country country.

Gilchrist pilfered 16 boundaries, including three sixes to carve out a masterful innings which fell just



one run short of Australia's highest individual score in a one-day match.

He was finally bowled by Sean Ervine, allowing the Australian record of 173, set by Gilchrist's former one-day opening partner Mark Waugh against the West Indies in 2001, to remain intact.
