Prime Minister Khaleda Zia leaves Dhaka today on a four-day official visit to the Republic of Indonesia and Brunei Darussalam.

Foreign Minister M Morshed Khan, State Minister for Expatriates Welfare and Overseas Employment. Quamrul Islam, attorney general, foreign secretary and other senior officials will accompany the prime

In Indonesia, the prime minister will hold official talks with President Megawati Soekarnoputri on January 24 at Istana Merdeka State Palace in

The entire gamut of bilateral relations between the two countries will be reviewed and the talks are expected to identify common grounds for strengthening cooperation in all relevant fields, particularly trade, investments and energy. A number of bilateral agreements are expected to be signed during the

Detective on suspect hunt murdered


A detective on a hunt for suspects was killed and police found the body with a broken neck near the Matuail Bridge in Demra on the outskirts of Dhaka in a morning search vester-

Police blamed the killing of Sub-Inspector Mosharraf Hossain of Detective Branch's Keraniganj zone on two suspects of murdering Sabuj, a local youth, last year.

Law enforcers sent the body of the 50-year-old officer to Mitford Hospital for an autopsy after they recovered it at about 7:00am.
"It's highly likely that he was

killed in a place and the body was dumped in Demra. We are trying to find the leads to the killing," Police Commissioner Ashraful Huda said of the unknown circumstances surrounding the death.

The killers took away his pistol and eight bullets, but his cellphone

"Mosharraf had dinner at Keraniganj police officers' mess before he left office for a manhunt," a police officer said.

The victim's wife Momtaz Begum said: "He called me at around 8:30pm Wednesday and told me to wait for him to shop together at the kitchen market in Mirpur

"As he didn't show up, I tried to

call him back, but his cellphone was off," said Momtaz who waited at the market until 10:00pm with their two sons before she returned home to West Manipur in Dhaka, thinking her husband was busy.

Early morning, Momtaz informed Keraniganj police who relayed the message to all police stations, sending law enforcers searching for their colleague.

Mosharraf arrested two suspected killers of Sabuj in previous operations and mounted his last hunt for two others in an area far from Keraniganj Police Station. Police said locals found a white

microbus that probably gave Mosharraf a free ride in the area for

tailing the suspects.

Abdus Salam filed a case with
Dhanmondi Police Station for the killing of his brother, father of sons Russell and Rabbi and daughters Moni and Mukta.

The body was taken to his home village in Bairahata in Madaripur for burial, the victim's family said.

Teesta water deal to have ripple effects on other common rivers

Indian water secretary says

Efforts by India and Bangladesh to work out an interim accord on sharing of Teesta river water, for which the secretary-level Joint Committee of Experts (JCE) set up a technical panel yesterday, are likely to have a bearing on similar arrangements for the other six rivers includ-

ing Muhri and Dharala. Indian Water Resources Secretary V K Duggal indicated this yesterday. Asked if the two-day JCE meeting found time to talk about the six other rivers, he said, "Let us wait for the results of the efforts of Teesta water-sharing. Then we can take up the case of the other rivers."

The issue of the six rivers did come up briefly on the first day of the meeting but sources said both sides will be focused on the interim accord for Teesta, sources said.

Iraq guerilla attacks kill 2 GIs, 7 others

Guerrillas yesterday attacked an Iraqi police post with assault rifles and a grenade, killing two police-men and a civilian, hours after a mortar attack on a US base killed two soldiers and wounded another.

Insurgents also opened fire on a bus carrying Iraqi women home from work at a military base west of Baghdad, killing four women and wounding six others. All the attacks were in the volatile "Sunni triangle" region around Baghdad.

The latest upsurge of violence came amid US talk of handing over political power to an Iraqi administration later this year and a dispute over whether this should be done before or after elections are held.

South of the capital near Diwaniya, a Spanish Civil Guard police commander was shot in the head and seriously wounded during a joint operation with Iraqi police against "members of a terrorist group", the Spanish Defence Ministrysaid.

Police near Falluja, a hotbed of resistance 50 km (30 miles) west of Baghdad, said guerrillas in a passing car lobbed a grenade and opened fire with AK-47 assault rifles at a checkpoint on the highway to the

town of Ramadi. "We were standing at our checkpoint and saw some cars come by From one of them, a grenade was thrown and Kalashnikovs were fired at us," policeman Maher Mohammad said. He said the attackers wore checkered headdresses around their faces.

Two policemen and a civilian were killed in the attack, and five police were wounded. A pool of blood lay on the side of the highway, along with a police vehicle pockmarked by bullets.

A US military spokeswoman in Saddam Hussein's hometown of Tikrit said mortars and rockets had been fired at an American base near


Baquba, 65 km north of Baghdad, on Wednesday evening.

"Last evening, we had a mortar attack on a forward operating base near Baquba which killed two soldiers from the 4th Infantry Division and critically wounded another," Major Josslyn Aberle said, adding that rockets were also used in the attack.

The deaths brought to 349 the number of US soldiers killed in action in Iraq since Washington launched a war in March to topple Saddam. Including non-combat deaths, the toll is 505.

"We were able to identify where the attack came from and responded by firing artillery shells at the location," Aberle said. "There are no indications, however, that any insurgents were killed in our

IOJ to gear up agitation against Ahmadiyyas

The factions of a fringe coalition partner have decided to step up the movement for declaration of the Ahmadiyyas non-Muslim, despite Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's refusal to accept the demand.

Political sources said Azizul Haq and Fazlul Haq Amini, MP, factions of the Islami Oikya Jote (IOJ) were determined to launch a 'vigorous agitation' across Bangladesh to force Khaleda's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP)-led coalition to bow to the anti-Ahmadiyya

The four-party coalition also

brings together the Jamaat-e-Islami and Jatiya Party (Naziur). 'We are ready to quit the alliance

and cut off ties with the government, but we won't budge an inch on the demand. We won't leave the street until the fulfilment of our demand," a top IOJ leader said, requesting not to be named.

He said his faction's links with the government slackened as the government did not include any of its leaders in the cabinet and ignored its voice in decision-


