






Aupee Karim, Actress: I was very much worried about the difference between the two media [TV and film]--how will I feel performing in films what will be the reaction of the audience? My opinion is that every artiste should act at least in one film, as it is a 'permanent' media while drama is not.

Sanjeeb Chowdhury, *Singer:* Film is a very strong medium to reach the larger audience as long as performing music is concerned. But the present condition of our cinema has almost made it impossible for band-groups like Dalchhut to playback. Working with Farooki, however, is a special experience: it has provided us great pleasure--pleasure of creativity. We have faith on him that he will not make trash films like many others. And Dalchhut will certainly continue in the cinema if the offer comes from someone like Farooki

Film, however, has its own characteristics that might not suit me. I'm in the final semester of my study and am planning for a job afterwards: I don't think film is my cup of tea. But if I get a chance in good films like Bachelor, I'll surely work.

Mad magazine artist Woodbridge dead

Longtime contributor known for detail

EORGE Woodbridge, an illustrator for *Mad* maga-Jillustrator 101 171111 50 years whose exquisitely detailed penand-ink drawings were featured in nearly every issue, has died. He was

Woodbridge died of emphysema Tuesday, said his wife, Deborah Woodbridge. "He had a tremendous eye for detail that showed up in his drawings," *Mad* Editor John Ficarra said Thursday. "We especially played to his history knowledge. When we gave him a piece on World War I, he would

draw the exact gun and belt buckle they were using then."


Woodbridge's delicate crosshatched illustrations were the result of careful research, particularly in rendering historical scenes. In fact, Woodbridge had a second career as an illustrator military history books, including the three-volume American Military Equipage, 1851-

A native of New York, Woodbridge began as a freelance artist for *Mad* in 1957, five years after the satirical magazine's inception. One of Woodbridge's most memorable illustrations

was for the 1965 sports satire 43-Man Squamish, about a nonsensical game in which the equipment included shepherd's crooks and diving flippers.

Upon entering the shop, customers are greeted with families of bauls sitting in the corner and singing their hearts out. Two groups of these singing-families alternate between Thursdays and Fridays every week and add to the ambience of the shop with their compositions

One of the families, who had performed last Thursday, said that they sang a whole lot of Lalon compositions and also a few selfmade numbers. 'I speak about the ideas which are so unreachable, yet

boy. 'We also goes around the city doing little shows and earning a living.' The boy's little sister and paternal aunt, who were sitting right next to him, offered to sing the song Bondhu tin din to the customers' delight.

According to Anushay, these bauls had approached her for some support initially. 'So I thought of this plan, where the bauls would come and entertain every weekend. The customers are requested to donate some on their free will, and thankfully there are some who grant with all their heart!'

Singing verses about life and death, these bauls become a part of the beauty inside the homely little store, with their dhol mondira and dotara. Sometimes it's truly a wonder to see them smiling and content with very little that they get out of their aesthetic music and creative
