

The road from Science Laboratory to National Press Club will be off-timits to rickshaws from February 22

Two more roads to become off-limits to rickshaws

Roads from Kalabagan crossing to Azimpur and the Science Laboratory to the National Press Club will be off-limits to rickshaws from February 25 in the latest ban on the slow-moving vehicles, blamed for traffic jam.

The decision was taken as part of efforts to reduce traffic jam, said Quamrul Islam Siddique, executive director of Dhaka Transport Coordination Board (DTCB).

Siddique told Star City that the decision came after a series of talks with local stakeholders who voiced opinions in favour of the clampdays.

On an alternative route for rickshaws, a DTCB official said there would be a two-way lane for rickshaws between the New Market opposite Chadni Chawk Supermarket and Dhanmondi Road No.1 for the convenience of commuters to Dhanmondi, Rayerbazar, Jigatala and Mohammadpur.

Rickshaws will be allowed to use two crossings -- one on Dhanmondi Road No. 6 and the other at Nilkhet, the official said.

Along the road from the Science Laboratory to Shahbagh to the Press Club, rickshaws will be allowed to cross two points -- one at the Bata crossing on the Elephant Road and the other at Kataban for movement from Hatirpool to Dhaka University, the official added.

But there will be no alternative lanes for rickshaws from the Elephant Road to Shahbagh to the Press Club, he said, adding the number of motorised vehicles plying the routes increased for

Rickshaws were banned from the stretch between Gabtali and Russel Square on Mirpur Road from December 20, 2002.

Bangladesh Transport Foundation has been engaged in holding meetings with professionals, business people and rickshawpullers to get feedback on the ban on rickshaws after the government decision faced resistance. Of the six meetings scheduled, two have taken place and the rest will take place by February 24.

Three other major roads -- from Progati Sarani to Mouchak, Bangla Motor to Mogbazar to Rampura and Rokeya Sarani to Farmgate -- will be made offlimits to rickshaws in phases in 2005, DTCB sources said.

Physically challenged want reserved seats in JS

Physically challenged people of the country want 12 reserved seats in the parliament to ensure that their voice is heard and they can be a part of the country's legislature.

The call comes after the ruling fourparty alliance government decided to increase the total number of seats in the parliament by another 150.

"We urge the government to keep provision for representatives of the physically handicapped in the parliament," said president of Mirpur Bauniabad disabled peoples' organisation Yousuf Ali in a press conference in the city last week.

The briefing was jointly arranged by the Trinomul Protibondhi Jonogoshthi (disabled people of grassroot level) and Action on Disability and Development, both nongovernment organisations working for the physically challenged.

Some countries have already ensured participation of disabled people in their state legislature. There are 11 lawmakers in South Africa and five in Uganda, who are physically challenged themselves, upholding the rights of the handicapped.

"Although people like us constitute ten per cent of the country's total population, we still can't express our opinion on decisions that concern us in the parliament," lamented visually challenged Supreme Court lawyer Mosharaf Hossain Talukder.

"We believe this is the right time to stamp our presence. We need representatives in the parliament and as the government is planning to increase seats, our demand should not be too difficult to entertain," added Talukder

According to World Health Organisation (WHO) statistics, 13 million people in Bangladesh are physically challenged. Interestingly, 80 handicapped candidates participated in the last Union Parisad (UP) election and

16 of them were elected.

"We don't want to live like burdens of the society. Given the chance, the physically disabled can also contribute to the country's development. But the general opinion of us is that we are useless. That kind of attitude is not conducive for democracy," said Talukder.

The organisations of the disabled are demanding the reserved seats because they feel that the financial solvency required to run in a traditional election is beyond the means of most physically challenged people. Their demands include one male and one female representative from each of the six divisions.

DCC's keep-city-clean plan for Eid day

Every year during the Eid-ul-Azha, the city gets littered with the waste from sacrificial animals, as there are no systematic disposal options.

This time, the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) has taken a programme to raise awareness of the city dwellers on how to handle the waste properly.

"We will start making announcements on mikes two days ahead of the Qurbani Eid in all the wards. The do's and don'ts prepared by the DCC regarding animal waste disposal will

be read out so that people get an idea how to deal with it," said a ward commissioner.

The DCC also plans to convey its waste management message from mosques during the last Friday prayer (Jumma) before Eid on January 30. There will be leaflets pasted on walls also about the Qurbani waste.

"It is necessary to raise awareness among the residents because a little alertness on their part can make the task much easier for us. That's why we are taking special measures to let them know what is expected," said Commander Sohel Farouqui, the chief

conservancy officer of DCC.

"If people keep the Qurbani waste in a separate dustbin other than throwing here and there, our cleaners would be able to pick it from the dustbin. It is very important that nobody dumps the waste in the drains," added Farouqui.

DCC cleaners and staffs would start working from 12 noon on the Eid day. Trucks for picking up the waste will roam around the city. Water lorries will be employed to clean the blood and other wastes.


The cleaning of the 16 temporary cow markets within the city would

start after 12pm as sacrificial animals are even sold on the Eid day.

"For the convenience of the city dwellers our staff will work night and day during the Eid," informed the chief conservancy officer.

"Most people complete their Qurbani by 2pm and some do it in the evening. The cleaners are expected to come within this time so that the wastes could be cleaned during the day. Otherwise it will cause foul odour and an unhygienic atmosphere," said commissioner of Ward 75 Mozammel Hog Mukta
