Suicide attack kills 10 near Sharon's house

At least ten people were killed yesterday in a suicide bomb attack on board a bus close to Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon's official residence in Jerusalem, military radio said.

The blast shortly before 9:00 am (0700 GMT) came as hundreds of Palestinian prisoners were about to be freed in a delicate deal between Israel and the Lebanese

guerrilla movement Hezbollah. But an Israeli official said the

prisoner swap would go ahead as planned.

Around 40 other people were also injured in the attack, a spokesman for the Magen David Adom rescue service told public radio

The scene of the blast, close to the junction between Aza Street

Ierusalem, was sealed off to reporters but an AFP correspondent said the front part of the number 19 bus had been completely blown out.

David Baker, an official in Sharon's office, said that the attack was proof of the Palestinian Authority's failure to crack down on hardliners.

"Israel has no chance but to wage an uncompromising war against terror," Baker told report-

"This is another example of Palestinians targeting Israelis in the hearts of their cities. The PA is doing aboslutely nothing to fight

Sharon was not in his house at the time of the blast but was staying on his ranch in the southern Negev desert, Israeli media reports said.

Capital kept off-limits for WorlTel suit

The telecoms watchdog is keeping Dhaka city off-limits to landline telephony of private operators due to a legal battle with the UK-based WorldTel that seeks a monopoly in the capital.

WorldTel obtained licence in July 2001 to run a 300,000 fixed phone-line network in the capital on a build-operate-own basis. It has served a legal notice on the Ministry of Post and Telecommunications asking it to

explain why it (WorldTel) should not be the only licensee to operate solely in the capital, as the agreement with the ministry stipulates.

Its lawyers say it was licensed to run fixed phone network in the capital in a monopolistic environment but the BTRC is planning to allow more operators.

WorldTel could not start operation, as its move to reach an interconnection agreement with the state monopoly in fixed phone, Bangladesh Telegraph and Telephone Board (BTTB), fell

"We want an amicable solution to the issue without further delay,' a WorldTel solicitor told The Daily Star last night. WorldTel's licence is still legally valid and the government should respect it, said the lawyer seeking anonymity.

WorldTel obtained licence at the fag end of the Awami League government and planned to invest \$300 million in the project. But the incumbent BNP-led government

Around 20,000 chickens, mainly layers, died in more than two dozen poultry farms in Gazipur since January 20 after they were

According to government officials and farm owners, the deaths were not related to bird flu.

The poultry farm owners said the chickens died immediately after they were inoculated with medicine supplied by the district livestock office. The aggrieved farmers later demonstrated in the district town demanding punish-ment to the livestock officials and seeking compensation for their

The farm owners also submitted a memorandum to the government seeking immediate action.

Mohammad Humayun Kabir Khan, owner of Al Amin Poultry Farm at Deshipara, lodged a general diary with Joydevepur Police Station on January 24, implicating the deaths to defective vaccines

supplied by the livestock office.

Majedul Islam Rashed, owner of Modern Poultry Farm, said he lost 1.500 chicken in five days after vaccination. Many birds are still ill he said.

District livestock officer Munshi Mohammad Inamul Hoque admitted that the deaths occurred following vaccination but it is vet to be confirmed whether the vaccines
