## Top Jihad boss boy killed in Israeli raid

An Israeli helicopter gunship nmed a missile into a car in Gaza City yesterday, killing a top Islamic Jihad commander and a 12-vearold bystander and drawing vows of revenge by Palestinian militants.

The attack on a car carrying Aziz al-Shami coincided with the start of a military trial in Gaza of Palestinians accused of killing three Americans, and a Washington Post report of an impending mission by US officials to discuss Israeli plans "disengage" from the **Palestinians** 

The Israeli army confirmed it had targeted the vehicle carrying Shami, who was a top commander in Jihad's "Jerusalem Brigades" armed wing and a relative and bodyguard of Islamic Jihad leader Abdallah al-Shami.

Doctors said Shami died severa hours after being critically wounded in the missile attack, which also killed a 12-year-old boy. Two other militants in Shami's car were seriously wounded and seven passersby were hit by shrapnel,

"Our people will not stop this resistance...and Jihad until the SEE PAGE 11 COL 7

## 10 killed, 60 Ctg pirates kill hurt in road accidents

Ten people were killed and more than 60 others injured in two road accidents in Madaripur and Noakhali yesterday

A Dhaka-bound passenger bus from Kalkini in Madaripur dashed against a roadside tree and was badly damaged at Panthanagar on Barisal-Dhaka highway, 20 km from the district headquarters, in the morning.

Six people died on the spot and at least 30 others were injured.

The dead included owner of the vehicle Badsha Howlader and helper Modhu. The others were yet to be identified.

Madaripur fire service sources

said the bus -- Sarbik Paribahan -was running at a very high speed before it hit the tree.

Of the injured, 18 were admitted to Madaripur Sadar Hospital and four shifted to Dhaka and other

# two crews, loot goods

Pirates killed two watchmen and looted some goods from a Mongolian flag carrier anchored at the outer anchorage of Chittagong Port in the early hours of yesterday, police and hospital sources said. The gang raided the 250-foot

MV Star-4 at about 3:00am. Port sources however said the

watchmen -- Shahidul Islam, 28 and Mofazzul Huq, 38 -- were injured while trying to resist the pirates. Member (operation) of

Chittagong Port Captain Amirul Islam said the injured watchmen were rescued by a tug boat and sent to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH). "So far as I know,

the two watchmen received injuries as pirates attacked them with lethal weapons." he added.

But CMCH sources said the watchmen were brought dead and their bodies would be sent for autopsy

Amanat Uddin, an official of RK Shipping, local agent of the ship, said the vessel was imported for scrapping here. "Pirates raided the vessel while it was waiting at the outer anchorage to be beached at Sitakundu coast. Two watchmen engaged by us were injured in the
