

Injured BCL leader dies

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) city north unit leader Omar Faruq Khan, who was shot on February 1, died at the Central Hospital in the city yesterday.

After autopsy at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), BCL leaders and activists received the body yesterday evening and took it to BCL Central Office at Bangabandhu Avenue.

Awami League President and

Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Sheikh Hasina, General Secretary Abdul Jalil and other senior party leaders including Sheikh Selim, Amir Hossian Amu, Obaidul Kader and BCL President Liaqat Sikder and General Secretary Nazrul Islam Babu placed wreath at Faruq's coffin to pay their last respect.

Faruq's relatives took the body to their village home at Uttar Joypur in Lakkipur for burial.

A student of management at Mirpur Bangla College and former general secretary of the college unit, Faruq was standing in front of their house at 4, Shaheed Minar Road in Kalyanpur at 7.15pm when five unidentified youths shot him in the chest.

He was admitted to DMCH first from where he was shifted to Chest Diseases Hospital. Later he was admitted to Central Hospital where he died at 8.30am.

Magurchhara blowout

Govt to go to int'l court to realise compensation

State Minister for Energy and Mineral Resources AKM Mosharraf Hossain has reiterated that the government would go to international court for realisation of compensation from US oil giant Unocal for Magurchhara blowout in 1997.

"We might need to go to the international court for realising the compensation," the state minister informed the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday in response to a query of a lawmaker.

Replying to Farid Uddin Chowdhury during question-answer hour, Mosharraf informed the House that the Unocal signed a supplementary agreement with the government in 1998 for not paying the com-

pensation.

"The then government secretly signed the supplementary agreement and the Unocal said compensation had been met through that deal," said the state minister.

In reply to another question, Mosharraf said the four-party-alliance government, after assuming power, initiated a move to realise the compensation.

He also informed the House that the government owes US\$77.96 million equivalent to TK 456.09 crore to international oil companies till December 2003.

Gas supply to Bogra by 2005, JS told

State Minister for Energy and Mineral Resources A K M Mosharraf Hosain yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that gas connection to Bogra will be given by 2005.

He said Nalka-Bogra gas line construction work has already started.

Responding to a question from BNP lawmaker Helaluzzaman Talukder Lalu, he said survey work for supplying gas to Rajshahi-Naogaon area is progressing.

He told the House that a donor agency has come forward to support the construction of gas line in the western region of the country.

'No plan to cancel quota system in govt jobs'

He said the government had no plan either to enhance or reduce the quota in government jobs.

Train kills one, body found in Ramna

A garment worker was killed in a train accident in Mohakhali, while police recovered body of an unidentified middle-aged man from Ramna Sunday.

Abdus Sobahan, 37, an employee at Orbits Network Ltd., was going to his working place at Rasulbagh in Mohakhali through the rail lines at Purba Nakhhalpara at around 7:45am.

Two trains came at a time and Sobahan could not notice the one coming from behind, which hit him and sliced him into two, said eyewitness Mohammad Idris.

Meanwhile, Ramna police recovered the body, aged around 45, from in front of Fazlul Haq Hall of Dhaka University at around 12:00 noon.

Police said he was an addict and might have died from overdose of drugs.
