

'Enact law to ensure safety of journalists'

Speakers at a roundtable yesterday called on all political parties to come forward to enact a law ensuring safety of journalists.

All the political parties should come on one platform now to ensure safety of the media persons, they said.

The School of Democracy and Governance organised the roundtable titled 'Measures to ensure security of journalists' at the Cirdap auditorium in the city.

The political parties should frame a policy together to stop torture and harassment of newsmen, said Mahi B Chowdhury, a BNP lawmaker and son of former president AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury.

Demanding security measures for the journalists, he said the government should also provide insurance facilities to protect them from torture.

As the attackers now go unpunished, they even feel encouraged to attack the newsmen, Mahi said.

"The journalists will have to put pressure on the government to get quick justice for the victims of harassment."

The School of Democracy and Governance would launch a series of programmes to create pressure on the government to this end, he added. Mahi is the president of the school.

Speaking as chief guest, the New Age Editor Enayetullah Khan said the journalists were being tortured due to absence of the rule of law and abuse of the law in the

country.

He said the district correspondents are more vulnerable to harassment than those working in Dhaka city. Sections 501 and 502 of the penal code are the main weapons to harass journalists, he added.

Awami League lawmaker Farook Kahn called on the politicians and members of the civil society to work together to enact a law ensuring safety of the journalists and quick justice for the victims.

Jatiya Party lawmaker GM Kader said the political parties use criminals during the national and local elections for their own interest. As a result, the elections were not held in a free and fair manner, he said, adding that if this process continues, no-one would be safe.

Saleem Samad, special correspondent of The Prothom Alo, stressed the need for raising a medical support fund for the journalists.

He also suggested building a network with the press clubs across the country in this regard.

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal President Hasanul Haque Inu, AP bureau chief Farid Hossain and Khairuzzaman Kamal of Bangladesh Human Rights Journalists' Association also spoke.

The School of Democracy also presented a visual presentation on torture on Tipu Sultan and killing of Shamsur Rahman and Manik Chandra Saha at the beginning of the conference.

12 mobile courts to enforce traffic law in city

The government has pressed 12 mobile courts into service at 12 police stations in the capital to enforce traffic law, check sale of adulterated food and curb snatching and extortion.

The police stations are Motijheel, Ramna, Mohammadpur, Mirpur, Demra, Shyampur, Tejgaon, Dhamondi, Pallabi, Kafrel, Lalbagh and Khilgaon, said a circular issued by the home ministry yesterday.

The government decided to

introduce the mobile courts as it was elated at the performance of mobile courts during Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Azha, said an official of the ministry.

Other tasks of the mobile courts include seizure of defective and unfit vehicles, removal of illegal structures, setting up of traffic check-posts at important intersections and arrest of hoarders.

Besides, the courts will take stringent measures against stockpiling of merchandise and construction materials on roads, check illegal parking and halting of vehicles at

busy crossings, the circular added.

Twenty-five mobile courts, pressed into service during Ramadan, fined over Tk 42 lakh, filed 6,000 cases on different charges.

The courts also arrested 29 people and seized 42 vehicles for

violation of traffic rules. They also closed two factories for producing adulterated food.

During Eid-ul-Azha, the government introduced more than 12 mobile courts in the city to check extortion from cattle traders.
