

More items join price hike race

Atta, pulses and powdered milk dearer

Soybean oil, which made its last round of rise only two weeks ago, rose further to Tk 58-60 per litre. It was selling at Tk 52 just after Eid. A five-litre container is now priced at Tk 280-290, up by Tk 15-20.

Side by side, prices of mustard and palm oil also went up by Tk 4-5 per litre.

In the Karwan Bazar market, fish traders were demanding exorbitant prices despite sufficient supply of different varieties.

Local *ruhi* was selling at Tk 160-170 per kilogram which was Tk 140-150 two weeks earlier and Tk 100-120 just before Eid. Imported varieties, which were Tk 80-100 before Eid, now being sold at Tk 110-130. Prawn sells at Tk 200-250 per kilogram depending on their sizes and local cat fish at Tk 300-350. However 'African' cat fish is still cheaper and sells at Tk 75-85 per kilogram. Pabda has become dearer by at least Tk 150 and sells at Tk 550-

600 a kilogram. Other varieties of fishes have also marked a similar rise.

Farm chickens were still selling at Tk 55-60 per kilogram and eggs Tk 36-38 per dozen. Beef sells at Tk 80-90 and mutton at Tk 160-170.

Local and Indian onions are static at Tk 18 and 20.

Market sources said prices of both onions and soybean oil are unlikely to go down before April because of 'some import factors'.

Meanwhile, ginger prices jumped to Tk 46-48 from last week's 40-42 per kilogram.

Among vegetables, potato sells at Tk 8-10 per kilogram, local beans Tk 10-12, tomato Tk 10-12, carrot Tk 10-12, green tomato Tk 12-14, radish Tk 6-8, cucumber Tk 15-16, paupa Tk 7-8, brinjal Tk 12-14, green chilli at Tk 30-35. However gourd prices are high and sells at Tk 20-25 a piece.

Prices of more items like *atta* (flour), pulses and powdered milk have joined the price hike race in the last one week.

Soybean oil which saw several rounds of rise in the last few months marked further rise. Fish prices soared further and is likely to become more dearer as local fishes will not be sufficiently available in the coming months.

However, prices of vegetables, farm chicken, eggs and onions remained static. Meat and rice prices also did not mark rise.

In the city markets yesterday, a two-kilogram packet of *atta* was selling at Tk 36 which was Tk 28 only a week ago.

Pulses, especially *masur* (lentil), became dearer. Lentil price increased by Tk 3-4 and was selling at Tk 50-52 per kilogram. Prices of tinned or packed powdered milk rose by Tk 8-10 per

Central Shishu Park to wear a new look

Project proposed to introduce 16 new items

plete renovation of the Central Shishu Park.

DCC officials said that revival of the outlook of the park will encourage more visitors and bring an increase in revenue.

The renovation cost estimated at Tk 92 crore will include repair-

ing the old worn out rides and introducing 16 new items. The existing rides which have already exceeded their life span of 10 years are deteriorating and may lead to serious accidents if precautionary measures are not taken.

"It is impossible for any machine to run properly after 10 years," said a concerned DCC official. "Most machines have parts that wear," he added. The official said some rides are still able to provide good service and attributed it to "DCC's strict maintenance."

Once approved by the ministry the DCC plans to complete the project by 2006.

Bangladesh Parjatan Corporation (BPC) built the Central Shishu Park at Suhrawardy Udyana in 1979 and handed it over to DCC for maintenance. The number of rides at that time was ten and in 1992 DCC added two more -- flying plane and flying rocket. Bangladesh Air Force presented another ride called F-6 fighter plane in 1997.

The sixteen new rides to be included are Barn-stormer, Roller-coaster, Mono-rail, Water-splash, Giant wheel, Viking Mars, Bumper cars, Laser shows

and 3-D movies. The project also proposes expansion of the area up to the police control room beside the park, which will increase from 15 acres at present to 19.

Two underpasses from the National Museum and Dhaka Club have been included in the proposal. Visitors will be able to reach the park easily. "It will help other passers-by too," the official added.

The entry ticket which is only Taka 5 now, may increase, but will not exceed Tk. 25. "The fee will still be much lower than private amusement parks," he said.

The Central Shishu Park is the country's first amusement park and is accessible to people of every social stratum. According to DCC, almost 5,500 visitors turn up everyday. Sources inside DCC said there will be an earning of Tk 18 crore every year after meeting maintenance costs if the project is implemented.



Numbered card to identify citizens

The bottom of the card will carry the holder's photo, thumb impression and signature of the issuing authority.

Husain came up with this method after intensive research over the last six years. He estimates the cost of one card at Tk 54 and it might take 3-4 years to introduce it across the country.

Through the card's security number its holder will be able to authenticate ownership of land also believes its inventor.

"This card will help the government's planned introduction of the Certificate of Land Ownership (CLO) by identifying the actual person," said Husain. The researcher said that any individual having this card will collect demand note for annual revenue of his land from the land directorate and will establish his right after paying this to the bank.

"If SSN-based land card is introduced, many deprived women in the country will get their due share of parental property," said Husain who hopes that he will receive the green light soon.

Husain is confident that his invention has the potential to increase government revenue, identify terrorists and criminals more easily and ensure security in the banking sector. Paying utility service bills will also become easier with the card.

Husain had submitted a letter to the Prime Minister's office on September 2002 explaining the functions and the potential of the card and appealed to be considered for introduction across the country.

The PMO sent it to the Ministry of Home and Ministry of Social Welfare. It then came to the Election Commission.

The EC has replied to both the ministries saying the SSN card could be considered for implementation. But Husain has not heard anything since.

"If the authorities implement the card through the Election Commission or the Statistical Bureau it will be easier to introduce," said Husain who hopes that he will receive the green light soon.
