The 70-year-old mayor fell sick from hypertension triggered by the abortive attack his family linked to a letter death threat last year.

Tayebur was heading back home after attending a function organised

Kalyan Parishad, an Islamic social welfare group, at the United Club Auditorium at noon.

Police seized the Pakistani-made grenade from the road near Khulna City Corporation (KCC) and sent it to army explosives experts for chemical test, but could not specify the motive for the attack on the ruling BNP's frontline local leader.



Case filed against Hasina, others for 'army rules breach'

A case was filed against Awami League President Sheikh Hasina and two opposition whips Faruq Khan and Mirza Azam with Cantonment Police Station accusing them of violating army rules and assaulting army personnel.

Water Resources Minister Hafiz Uddin Ahmad, who represents the defence ministry in parliament,
