The government has legalized gambling in all clubs so that they can earn some money to meet their expenses. But for the last few years the scenario has taken an ugly turn with terrorists taking over different clubs driving the sport-loving organ-

isers out. "It was not long ago when I thought a visit to the club was the best way to relax once my work was over. Now I don't even feel like going there so often because of the unhealthy atmosphere," said a sports personality preferring anonymity.

"If you go to some clubs especially the smaller one you will hardly find any sporting activities," quipped another sports lover.

"Some clubs have turned into dens for mastaans. There are very few genuine sports organisers at those clubs," added a veteran Arambagh official

"The government should immediately ban gambling in all clubs to restore sanity in the sports arena, urged another sports organiser.

'This is an ominous sign. In the coming days you might see people getting killed for a trivial on-field confrontation," said another organiser as Piaru's death dominated the discussions everywhere.



Pakistan fast bowler Shoaib Akhtar

says it would be wrong to view the ice-breaking series against India as a duel between him and leading India batsman Sachin Tendulkar.

"The media may bill it as a 'Shoaib rs Tendulkar contest, but this series is much more than that. We have to go at all the Indian batsmen if we want to win the series," Akhtar told this news agency on Monday.

"If we play as a team we will win. Cricket is definitely a team game although individuals might dominate it," the 28-year-old added.

Pakistan and India play five oneday matches and three Tests, starting with the first one-dayer in Karachi on March 13. The Indians have not played any Tests in Pakistan in 14 vears.

In the 2003 World Cup in South Africa, Tendulkar belted 98 runs from 75 balls to lead India to a sixwicket win over Pakistan with Akhtar going for 72 runs in his 10 overs. SEE PAGE 14 COL 1

England and West Indies have played some memorable matches over the years and now it's the turn of their juniors to carry on the great tradition in the second Cup semifi-nal of the Fifth ICC U-19 World Cup today.

Bangladesh Television will telecast the day-night affair at the Bangabandhu National Stadium from 1.30pm. The winners go on to face Pakistan in the grand final on March 5 at the same venue.

England will start the game as favourites because they remain the only side with a 100 per cent unbeaten record thanks to the tremendous batting of captain Alastair Cook

highest run-scorer with 350 runs including back-to-back unbeaten centuries and an impressive average of 87.50.

The English are also strong in the bowling department through Tim Bresnan, the right-arm pacer, with 16 wickets at a miserly average of

West Indies, on the other hand, admittedly, have been unpredictable on way to the last four but that should not take away the fact they possess some stars of their own.

The Calypso cricketers will be banking on Tishan Maraj, Xavier Marshall and Lendl Simmons. The trio have hit centuries despite the side being dismissed cheaply on two occasions against Pakistan (88) and 157 against India under lights at the BNS.

Among the bowlers, right-arm paceman Lionel Baker has picked up 12 wickets. However a shin injury makes him doubtful for the bigmatch.

Team manager Roland Sampath said a decision to include Baker would be made in the morning.

West Indies will also be relying on Ravi Rampaul, the only bowler with one-day international experience. He is back to full fitness after recovering from a virus.

But their opponents were not concerned.

"We've seen Ravi in action before on TV. We'll approach this game in the same way as all of our other matches," said England team manager John Abrahams.

Leg-spinner Kumble and seamer Agarkar were omitted from the 15man touring squad announced on Monday, but were expected to be fit by the time the three-Test series begins on March 28.

Kumble, who suffered a shoulder injury on the recent tour of Australia, is India's most successful one-day bowler with 315 wickets.

Agarkar is recovering from a shin injury, also sustained in Australia.

However, seamer Zaheer Khan and middle-order batsman Mohammad Kaif returned to the squad after missing the one-day series in Australia due to injuries.
