# **ADR** to mitigate sufferings of poor litigants

## CJ tells regional workshop

**UNB**, Dhaka

Chief Justice Syed JR Mudassir Husain yesterday said alternate dispute resolution (ADR), being much cheaper and speedier than the existing legal system, can greatly mitigate the sufferings of poor litigants.

"Increasing expenses of litiga-tion, delay in disposal of cases and huge backlogs in our legal system have virtually shaken the confidence of the people in the judi-ciary," he said, speaking as chief guest at the concluding session of a two-day regional workshop on

The chief justice was of the view that the real success of ADR could not be achieved merely by bringing some changes in procedural law and taking some administrative steps for introduction of the same.

He said: "Now there is a need to promote the culture of ADR at community level from the bottom up because the prevalent attitude of the people, including the judges

and lawyers is not so encouraging.

Justice Husain stressed the urgency of creating a regular corps of trained and efficient mediators/neutrals, "relying upon whom the judges or the parties in dispute can comfortably go" for the process of ADR methods.

The workshop, organised by the British Council, adopted a regional action plan and came up with country-specific recommendations for promoting and instituting

A major focus of the workshop was on training for developing professional mediators and sensiising judges, lawyers, policymakers, litigants and the

Eminent legal experts, government officials, academicians, NGO and civil society leaders from five South Asian countries Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka - took part in the workshop.
