

Alex Ferguson's Manchester United host FC Porto in the European Champions League on Tuesday in what is looking more and more like a defining moment oftruth

At 2-1 down from the first leg of their first knockout round clash, United, nine points behind Arsenal in the Premiership and without Roy Keane who was sent off in the first leg, badly need a Champions League triumph to boost confidence among the ranks.

The talents of Ferguson's newly-appointed assistant Walter Smith will help a side in the shadow of Arsenal who are thriving in both domestic and European competition

FC Porto, under the guidance of 2003 UEFA coach of the year Jose Mourinho, are, like Arsenal, unbeaten in their league this season but have lost all previous six trips to England including a 4-0 defeat at Old Trafford in 1997.

United's attempt at their eighth consecutive Champions League quarter-final is hampered by defensive question marks. Ferguson did not buy during the winter transfer window to replace the suspended Rio Ferdinand which could be seen as a mistake which might prove his undoing.

"We've been hit hard in defence through losing Ferdinand, coupled with other injuries and suspensions," he said. "You don't want to be changing your back four all the time, but that's what we've had to

"It hasn't stopped us attacking. We are still capable of scoring and I'm sure we will score goals on Tuesday. We scored first in Portugual. and we had chances for a second. That might have killed them off. Instead, they created three chances and scored from two of them.

"That shows Porto are a good team, but I don't think they are great travellers. They will have a hard night if there's a real electric atmosphere at Old Trafford.

"The important thing now is for the fans to make it a real European night on Tuesday and for us to make sure we get a lot of threats on goal.

European champions AC Milan maintained their lead at the top of Serie A with an impressive 3-1 win over Sampdoria on Sunday but AS Roma kept on their tail after a 4-1 crushing of Inter Milan.

Milan lead on 61 points with Roma on 56, while champions Juventus, who won 3-2 at Brescia on Saturday, are a further point behind in third place.

Andrea Pirlo put Milan ahead in the 17th minute but Cristiano Doni brought the enterprising visitors level 10 minutes later.

A header from Filippo Inzaghi before the break and then a welltaken goal from Brazilian Kaka in the second half ensured Carlo Ancelotti's side's 10th win from

their last 11 league games. Roma's victory was not as

emphatic as the result suggests, with two of the goals coming in the final three minutes after Inter's Ivan Cordoba had been sent off.

But another outstanding performance from striker Antonio Cassano ensured Inter's fourth straight league defeat despite one of their better displays in recent

weeks. Lazio's game at Bologna was postponed due to snow but Roberto Mancini's side remain in fourth place.

After some sparkling moves in the opening minutes, Milan went ahead through Pirlo's 25-metre drive which flew in off the inside of the post

Leicester players hope for release

A senior Spanish judge will con-sider on Monday whether or not the three Premiership footballers facing charges of sexual assault can be freed from prison.

Leicester City's Paul Dickov, Keith Gillespie and Frank Sinclair spent a third night in prison here on Sunday after the allegations of assault were levelled at them by three German women who claim they were attacked while the team spent a mid-season break at the La Manga complex.

A judge in Cartagena will now review latest developments in the case but the three players are not expected to attend the hearing.

Keith Gillespie's girlfriend, Kelly Maguire, visited the player for over two hours but refused to speak to reporters when she left.

Leicester, battling against relegation from the Premiership, want the three men released in time for the team's next league match against Birmingham next Saturday.

Leicester member of parlia-ment Keith Vaz said he has written to the judge, offering to act as guarantor should the three be granted bail.
