The movement of ships in Chittagong Port channel has become risky as navigability of the river Karnaphuli has been badly affected due to massive siltation.

Lack of proper maintenance and the irregular dredging of the port channel have further worsened the situation, experts said.

They suggest immediate dredging of the channel up to the estuary to avoid future disaster and ensure existence of the Chittagong port, lifeline of the country's economy.

A concerned official of the Hydrography Department, however, has had the different view. He said, "It is not fact that we don't conduct regular dredging in the channel.

"We do conduct dredging on regular basis and have to keep data of every 15-day to know the actual navigability," the official said.
